- Shore excursions can be booked onboard, using the "sign-up lists" available at the Excursions desk. Debark tours ending at the airport and transfers can now be pre-booked prior your cruise.
- In order to provide the best service and to avoid disappointments, please book your shore excursions as early as possible: places are limited and there is a booking deadline for each port.
- A minimum number of participants is required for each tour; if the required number is not attained, the tour may be cancelled.
- Cancellation and changes are possible until the booking deadline. After the booking deadline, 100% cancellation fees will be charged.

- Departure times of the tour are mentioned on the daily program of each port.

ÎLES DES SAINTES (Terre-de-Haut) - Speed boat tour and snorkel in Les Saintes bay

Experience the beauty of the Les Saints Archipelago from a unique perspective during this panoramic sightseeing and snorkeling guided journey by speed boat.

Sail along the beautiful bay, passing by Ilet Cabrit, Terre de Bas, Ilet Redonde, Grand Ilet, Ilet de la Coche, Ilets Les Augustins. Then stop for a guided snorkeling session in the warm, crystal-clear waters nearest Pain de Sucre.

Please note: This tour is not suitable for guests with reduced mobility, back or neck issues and pregnant women. Min age: 7 years old (minors must be accompanied by an adult). Max weight: 220 lbs/100 kg.

Snorkeling is optional, Guests participating to the snorkeling must know how to swim.

Useful tips: wear aqua shoes and your swimsuit under your clothing and bring a towel, sunscreen, sunglasses and a hat. Mask, snorkel, and snorkel vest are provided (no fins).

DOMINICA - The Indian River by rowboat

Situated in the center of the town of Portsmouth to the North of Dominica, the Indian River is like a mini-Amazon teeming with life. It owes its name to the Kalinago people, formerly known as Carib Indians, who settled on its upper banks.

The river gushes down the Morne aux Diables mountain range and then meanders gently to the lowlands of Portsmouth where it flows into the Caribbean Sea. As it is below sea level, the water in the lower parts of the river is brackish giving rise to a unique ecosystem of flora and fauna. Some of the species, which include herons, kingfishers, and iguanas, are only to be found in this particular area of Dominica. Many of which are still present after the passing of devastating hurricane Maria. Vegetation continues to grow up and return in full force.

Experienced boatmen will take the oars and row you along the river in slow moving wooden boats so that you can appreciate the great variety of wildlife and plants on the riverbank at your leisure.

See for yourself the places where scenes from "Pirates of the Caribbean" were filmed. Upriver, you will get off the boat for a while to take a short 10-minute stroll through the botanical gardens and visit the renowned 'Bush Bar'. Try the signature rum punch, aptly named "Dynamite", a singularly potent brew. There is lots to see so don't forget to take your camera.

Afterwards you will get back into the rowing boat for a trip down river where you will board your buses and return to the ship.

Please note: There is a 15-minute drive between the port and the Indian Rivier, with a driver-guide. River local guides will take over your driver guide on the rowboat. The boat trip will be preceded by a security briefing. Rowboats can accommodate 8 passengers. You will spend approx. one hour up and down on the river. Guests are advised to bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent and water.



DOMINICA - Love & Chocolate

Enjoy a scenic tour of the island in air-conditioned comfort as you head towards your destination: the Pointe Baptiste Estate, located near Calibishie Village. The estate is a private domain stretching over 25 acres. There is a historical guesthouse from 1930s, a chocolate factory with a cottage above it and magnificent gardens filled with flowers.

It all began with a love story between two British aristocrats. Lennox Napier and Elma Gordon Cumming discovered Dominica in 1931 when on a Caribbean cruise, they moved there the following year and settled near Calibishie, building a house they named Pointe Baptiste in the midst of inaccessible virgin forest.

Their grandson grew up at Pointe Baptiste but also spent time in England and France where he developed a passion for fine chocolate. Back to Dominica, he decided to study the art of chocolate to produce locally fine chocolate, building a few drying racks and making a small quantity of 80% dark chocolate from cocoa beans grown on the estate. Nowadays, the chocolate factory is a small family run business; the cocoa beans are grown and harvested on the Pointe Baptiste estate using ecologically sound, sustainable practices.

Find out about chocolate making and discover the inimitable taste of this gourmet chocolate: dark chocolate (60%, 80 %, 90% or even 100% pure cocoa beans) flavored with Ginger, Coffee, Spice (Nutmeg, Cinnamon & Cloves), Hot Pepper, Lemongrass, Tangerine, Mint and Milk chocolate. Each guest will be given a bar of chocolate of their choice and can of course purchase chocolate truffles or cocoa nibs.

This excursion also includes a tour of the flower garden, one of the most beautiful in Dominica with a wide variety of mature trees, flowers, orchids and medicinal plants. The air is heavy with the scent of jasmín, ylang-ylang and frangipani trees and it is a veritable paradise for birds, butterflies and nature lovers. After the tour there will be time for some refreshments before returning to the ship.

Please note: Guests are advised to wear comfortable walking shoes and to bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent and water. Driving time is approximately 50/60 minutes (each way, on a winding road) between Cabrits and Pointe Baptiste.

DOMINICA - Syndicate National Park nature trail and falls

Your Excursion begins with a short, air-conditioned drive through the town of Portsmouth passing by the scenic Indian River up to the Syndicate National Park, nestled on the foot of Dominica's tallest mountain (Morne Diablotin), in the Northern Forest Reserve.

A local Forest Guide will then join you and lead you on a comprehensive hike on the Nature Trail, approximately 2000 ft. (600 mt) above sea level, narrating in detail the existing flora and fauna and exotic bird life within this Forest Reserve.

This Reserve is exclusive in that it is the last remaining habitat where one of the endemic National Birds, the Sisserou and the Jaco Parrot can be found. The Sisserou has been relocated to a bird sanctuary off island until most vegetation has returned.

After leaving Syndicate proceed to the Milton Falls. Syndicate Falls, sometimes referred to as Milton Falls, a secluded waterfall in the vicinity of the Syndicate Estate surrounded by lush forest, and as the water plunges down the rock into a pool, while showing the strength of the water. You will have the chance to take a refreshing swim in the lovely natural waterfall-pool. Walk back to the Syndicate Cafe and have a refreshment before returning to your ship in Cabrits.

Please note: The walk is approx. 1.5 hours at a gentle pace on a relatively easy route which is also flat and well signposted.

The Milton Falls Trail is a short 15mins walk with minimal elevation gain but 4 river crossings (it is mandatory to wear proper hiking shoes). Rain Forest terrain is muddy and can be slippery.

Useful tips: wear light clothes and comfortable hiking shoes (closed shoes with grip) and bring a hat, sunscreen, water-shoes and insect repellent and water. If you plan to swim at the waterfall site, wear a swimsuit under a cover-up and bring a towel.

Driving time is approximately 45 minutes (each way) between Cabrits and the Syndicate National Park, with a driver-guide (the hiking guide will join the group at the National Park).



DOMINICA - Touna Auté Carib Native Village

A fascinating encounter with Dominica's Kalinago community at Touna Auté village.

Kalinagos live in a communally owned mountain and coastal area on the northeast of the island, bounded by the stunning Pagua River. Touna Auté is surrounded by spectacular mountain gorges; and home of one of the island's endemic parrots called the Jaco red necked. The chief of the community, a former Kalinago chief, will welcome you and give you a historical overview of the Kalinago people. You will learn about their ancestral and sustainable cultivation techniques, how cassava bread is made and discover the secrets of the medicinal plants still widely used in their daily lives. Weather permitting, you can also swim in the crystal-clear waters of the river's pools.

You'll also have the chance to sample a few drinks and local specialities, and shop for the traditional arts and crafts of which the Kalinago people are so proud.

A fascinating encounter with the Kalinago people. The village is located in the north-east of Dominica on the banks of the Pagua River, also known as the Caribs. The chief of the community, a former Kalinago chief, will welcome you and give you a historical overview of the Kalinago people. You will learn about their ancestral and sustainable cultivation techniques, how cassava bread is made and discover the secrets of the medicinal plants still widely used in their daily lives. Weather permitting, you can also swim in the crystal-clear waters of the river. You'll also have the chance to sample a few drinks and local specialities, and shop for the traditional arts and crafts of which the Kalinago people are so proud.

Please note: This tour involves moderate walking over uneven surfaces, with some inclines and steps.

Useful tips: wear light clothes and comfortable hiking shoes (closed shoes with grip) and bring a hat, water-shoes, sunscreen, insect repellent and water. If you plan to swim at the river pools, wear a swimsuit under a cover-up and bring a towel.

Driving time is approximately 60 minutes (each way, on a winding road) between Cabrits and Touna Auté, with a driver-guide (the guide of the village will join the group upon arrival at Touna Auté).

GRENADA - Catamaran sailing and snorkeling tour

From St. George's Harbor, you will sail on a catamaran along Grenada's west coast to stop at Molinere Bay.

Here you will enjoy a snorkeling stop to discover the underwater sculpture park, located in Granada's marine protected area. These statues are sympathetically located to enhance the reef, making natural use of its varied topography.

Then you will sail to Mango Bay beach (wet landing) for a second stop before a one-hour sailing back to the cruise terminal.

Unlimited beverages are provided throughout, including rum punch, juices, and mineral water.

Please note: This tour is not suitable for guests with reduced mobility, back or neck issues and pregnant women. Guests must walk in ankle-deep water to (dis)embark to boat at Mango Bay. Half of the boat has shade.

Snorkeling is optional, Guests participating to the snorkeling must be experienced swimmers.

Unlimited beverages are provided throughout including rum punch (only after the snorkeling), juices and mineral water.

Helpful hints: wear your swimsuit under a cover-up and bring a towel, sunscreen, sunglasses, aqua shoes and a hat. Mask, snorkel, and snorkel vest are provided (no fins).



MARTINIQUE (Grande Anse d’Arlet) - Explore the South of Martinique

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Discover the south part of Martinique for an authentic tour that will offer you the most beautiful views, from a pottery village to a distillery through the unmissable Diamond Rock. Take in art, history, architecture, culture, and natural beauty during your time in Martinique.

The tour starts with the small town of Anses d'Arlet, famous for its pretty traditional Creole houses covered with scale-tiled roofs. Facing the large pontoon with its bell tower, Saint-Henri church became an iconic view of the island.

Drive along the coastal road to a viewpoint overlooking Diamond Rock (Rocher du Diamant), another iconic sight in Martinique. After a photo stop, you will head to Cap 110, a memorial erected in memory of slavery. This Memorial consists of 15 busts of 2.5 meters in height arranged triangularly, to represent the slavery trade triangle between Americas, Europe and Africa.

Continue to Le Diamant village, where you will discover at the local market tropical fruits, spices and much more!

You cannot have had the full experience of Martinique without sampling their famous rum! Your next stop will be at Trois Rivières Rum Distillery, you will learn about their special white and aged vintage rums since 1976.

The very last stop will be at the famous “pottery village” located on a former Jesuit Monastery near Les Trois Ilets. You will have approx. 40 minutes to visit the “Village de la Poterie” and discover the workshops of skilled craftsmen and artists, see their creations and maybe you pick up a great souvenir to take back home.

Please note: Roads are winding, so this is not the ideal tour for guests suffering from motion sickness.

Useful tips: wear weather-appropriate clothes and comfortable walking shoes and to bring a hat, sunscreen, and water.

GRENADA - Trek to Bamboo Fall

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This excursion is a must for all Nature lovers; it is a wonderful journey of discovery starting at St George’s and following steep winding roads culminating at the rain forest peak, an amazing spot some 1900ft above sea level. This is Grand Etang Forest, a sanctuary and nature reserve located in the islands Central Mountain Range. Here lush vegetation, towering mahogany trees, ferns and colourful tropical flowers provide a vivid background to a wide cross section of bird and animal life. If you enjoy trekking, then you will love the trail through the rainforest to reach Bamboo falls. The trek will take you over a private plantation where you will see nutmeg, cocoa, bananas, and many other vibrant tropical plants. It can be muddy and slippery, especially if it has rained recently, so please choose your footwear accordingly. Bamboo Falls is known as one of the most famous and beautiful Grenada’s waterfalls and is certainly worth the 30-minute trek to get there.

Fresh local organic orange juice will be available on your return to the Cruise Terminal.

Enjoy unspoilt nature at its finest and join us on this unforgettable Eco trek.

Please note: This tour must be considered strenuous and is suitable only for guest who are in very good physical conditions. Rain Forest terrain is muddy and can be slippery. Before arriving to the fall guests must cross a river and have feet up to the knees into the water.

Helpful hints: wear light clothes and comfortable hiking shoes (closed shoes with grip) and bring a hat, sunscreen, and water.

Guests who wish to swim at the waterfall are advised to wear a swimsuit under a cover-up and bring aqua shoes.

The drive from the ship to the start of the trail takes approximately 45 minutes each way, on a winding and bumpy road.



GRENADA - Chocolate and falls

This aromatic island tour will allow you to know everything about the “Jouvay” organic chocolate production at the Diamond Chocolate Factory nestled in the village of Victoria on the west coast of Grenada. You’ll find it in an 18th-century converted rum distillery, which was built by French monks. Nowadays, the factory’s responsible for making “Jouvay” – one of the world’s top 10 chocolates, according to National Geographic. This chocolate’s completely organic and you’ll learn how it’s made – from the harvest of the cocoa beans, to watching them dry on trays under the Caribbean sun.

A visit to the garden of cocoa trees to see, cocoa, cloves, chili, nutmeg, flowers, fruits, followed by a delicious chocolate tasting, will conclude this pleasant visit to one of the most amazing sites in the Caribbean.

Next, proceed for a visit to Concord Fall, where nutmeg and cocoa trees grow along the flanks of the hills in the tropical forest. Upon arrival, relax with a complementary drink and take a refreshing swim in the lovely natural waterfall-pool (Conditions permitting). Following your visit, commence the approximately 45-minute drive back to the cruise terminal.

Please note: Guests will get the opportunity to swim at the waterfall site. The water at the waterfall is not crystal clear at all times especially when it rains, however, it is safe to swim or take a quick dip. Terrain at the waterfall is uneven and may be slippery.

Helpful hints: wear a swimsuit under your clothes and bring sunscreen, a hat, sunglasses, a towel from the ship and water.

The tour sequence may vary. There’s not visit inside the chocolate factory.

The drive from St George’s to the Chocolate factory will take 1h20 minutes, on a winding road.

TOBAGO CAYS - Discover the Southern Grenadines by sailing catamaran

Cruise through the crystal blue waters and sparkling white sand beaches of the Marine National Park of Tobago Cays. Our first stop is at the Horseshoe Reef for snorkeling and swimming then on to view the exclusive Palm Island Resort. This will be followed by a rum punch and swim stop at the sparkling white sand beach of Mayreau, Salt Whistle, one of the top 10 beaches in the Caribbean. Swim and snorkel as much as you want on this truly memorable tour. You will be back at the beach for the ship’s barbecue (weather permitting).

Please note: This tour is not suitable for guests with reduced mobility, back or neck issues and pregnant women.

Min age is 12 years (accompanied by an adult). Snorkeling is optional, Guests participating to the snorkeling must be experienced swimmers.

Useful tips: wear your swimsuit under a cover-up and bring a hat, sunscreen, sunglasses, a towel. Snorkeling equipment is not provided, please bring your equipment from the ship.

The itinerary and the tour sequence may be changed at Captain’s discretion depending on weather conditions and tide.



ST LUCIA (Marigot bay) - Panoramic Caribbean Coast and Soufrière

This tour leaves from Marigot and ends in Soufrière.

Departing from beautiful Marigot Bay, you will travel along the western coast on the winding main road leading to the South of the island, bypassing the fishing villages of Anse la Raye and Canaries. Arrive at the hotel “Villa des Pitons” (or similar) for a delicious Creole lunch. Nestled on the hillside this enchanting resort affords a spectacular view of St. Lucia’s rain forest. The sight of the majestic Pitons, two great peaks which have come to be a symbol of the island itself, will fill you with awe.

Your journey will continue to an award-winning historical site, the Soufriere Estate’s Diamond Botanical Gardens, Waterfall & Mineral Baths. Established in 1745, it is one of the oldest estates on the island. A guided tour takes you through the beautiful Botanical Gardens and the falls which cascade down through mineral-streaked rock walls and jungle thick ferns. The water forms a stream that flows through underground pipes to a series of baths at different temperatures. These hot mineral springs are enjoyed today for therapeutic bathing.

Driving up through lushly verdant rainforest you will enter the world’s only drive-in volcano, La Soufrière. The roads lead you right up to the remnants of a volcanic crater; a moonscape of barren earth and gravel where pools of muddy water bubble and belch out clouds of steam and a smell of sulphur pervades the atmosphere. You can enjoy a warm dip in the sulphureous pool below the bridge.

Please note: A buffet lunch will be provided, but beverages are not included.

Useful tips: wear a swimsuit under your clothes and comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent, water and US \$ (to purchase gifts of additional beverages). Water shoes and swimming goggles can be useful.

The sulphureous water in the pool could damage jewelry and swimsuits and may irritate the eyes.

The journey to Soufrière takes approximately 1h45, on a winding road. Guests who suffer from motion sickness should take necessary precautions before the tour. Coasters or minibuses have small seats and limited space and legroom.

ST LUCIA (Marigot bay) - Offroad adventure in St Lucia

A combination of fun, history, sightseeing and a change to see the island from a totally different perspective!

Take off in your jeep and embark on your journey where you will see in the valley banana plants swaying in the breeze and you enjoy a bit of off-road experience whilst driving through many communities. Stop along the route for a chance to sample refreshing coconut water and other seasonal fruits. Your forest adventure begins as you arrive at the start of your short hike which takes you along a river to a typical local waterfall of water cascading over the rocks, set in the lush greenery of the surrounding vegetation. Enjoy a cool dip in the river before heading back to the jeep for a drive to the nearby quaint and rustic fishing village of Anse la Raye. Interact with the villagers and stroll around the waterfront and maybe a chance to see the fishermen pulling in their catch for the day. Visit the historical Roman Catholic village church, one of the oldest churches on the island. On your return journey, drive along a coastal road enjoying the scenery with elevated sea views, just perfect for photos. A final stop at the Marigot Bay viewpoint is made and an opportunity to purchase some of the most delicious local sauces on island. Drive to your ship, with wonderful memories of a fun-filled day!

Please note: This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility, pregnant women or anyone suffering from conditions (back, neck or other) which may be affected by bumpy roads. Vehicles are 4WD open back vehicles, that can accommodate 10 or 14 passengers. Participants should remain seated when driving along the roads.

Useful tips: wear weather-appropriate clothes and comfortable walking shoes and to bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent and water. For the stop at the waterfall, wear a swimsuit under your clothes and to bring a towel from the ship and watershoes. The water at the waterfall is not crystal clear at all times especially when it rains, and the river carries topsoil and silt which makes the water seem unclean. However, it is safe to swim or take a quick dip. The walk to the waterfall is 15 minutes approx. each way over an uneven trail with rough ground and natural rocks that might be slippery. Be prepared to get your feet/shoes wet when going through the stream.



ST LUCIA (Marigot bay) – Visit to a tropical fruit farm

Walk around the farm where you can discover local fruits such as golden apples, guavas and Souriee/Bilimbi. You'll watch a coconut-cutting demonstration and be able to drink fresh coconut water (subject to availability) and taste coconut jelly. You will watch a demonstration of banana harvesting and learn about the differences between bananas and plantains.

Tasting of the fruit and vegetables that make up the national dish. It consists of green bananas and salted fish with cucumber salad and fried plantains. You can also try some of the different local sauces, such as banana ketchup and barbecue sauce, spicy sauces and many others. For the connoisseur or curious novice, you can also sample some of the local rums, such as banana liqueur, spiced rum, Bounty rum and Chairmans rum.

Please note: The journey from Marigot to the farm takes around 15 minutes on a rough road.

Useful tips: wear weather-appropriate clothing and comfortable shoes, and bring a hat, sun cream, insect repellent and water. There is a small shop selling products from the farm, so remember to take some cash with you.

SAINT LUCIA (Soufrière) - Natural attractions of La Soufrière

Drive through the town of Soufrière, bypassing the town square and the Cathedral, and reach the Sulphur Springs park, known as the Caribbean's, only drive-in volcano. The roads lead you right up to the remnants of a volcanic crater; a moonscape of barren earth and gravel where pools of muddy water bubble and belch out clouds of steam and a smell of sulphur pervades the atmosphere.

Your journey will continue to the Soufriere Estate's Diamond Botanical Gardens, Waterfall & Mineral Baths. Established in 1745, it is one of the oldest estates on the island.

Admire the tropical plants along the pathway and the magnificent waterfall before getting back on the bus.

After a short drive you will arrive at a restaurant nestled on the hillside, that affords a spectacular view of the Pitons, two majestic twin peaks soaring out of the sea at Soufrière Bay which have come to be a symbol of the Saint Lucia. Be sure to have your cameras at the ready for a splendid photo opportunity, while you enjoy a complementary local rum or fruit punch while relaxing on the verandah. The tour ends with a short drive down to the port, where your ship awaits.

Please note: Guests are advised to wear weather-appropriate clothes and comfortable walking shoes and to bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent, water and USD if they wish to purchase a small souvenir.

Coasters or minibuses have small seats and limited space and legroom. Roads in St Lucia are winding and bumpy.



SAINT LUCIA (Soufrière) - Zip line ride at Morne Coubaril Estate

This excursion combines a short sightseeing tour with the adrenaline rush of zipping under the sheer Petit Piton, with breathtaking views of the historic town of Soufrière and the Caribbean Sea.

Depart ship and take a short drive through the rustic town of Soufrière up to the Morne Coubaril Estate in Soufrière. Take a guided tour of this working plantation and the gardens well stocked with the plants and flowers indigenous to the island.

Your guide will lead you up the estate driveway to manioc house where you will learn how cassava bread is made, you will learn about the process of de-husking a coconut and oven drying copra, before sampling some coconut water and jelly. Taste a ripe cocoa bean at the cocoa and coffee house before seeing the process of fermentation and bean drying, and the cocoa dance used to polish the dried beans. See the mule-driven sugar cane mill and enjoy some delicious fresh cane juice.

After the guided tour, you will be equipped with harness, helmet and gloves and be given a safety briefing and training demonstration before setting off on your zip line adventure.

The zip line offers a total immersion in the natural environment and panoramic view of the bay and the awe-inspiring Pitons. Eight zip cables move you effortlessly through the estate, before being carried into a canopy of banyan, coconut, plum and mango trees and across a bamboo-shadowed gorge. After your zip line adventure, you will enjoy some refreshment at a local restaurant close to the gift shop, before you return to the port.

Please note: This tour is only for Guest who are in very good physical conditions and it is not suitable for guests with fear of height, pregnant women, persons with heart or respiratory conditions. Participants will have to sign a waiver.

Coasters or minibuses have small seats and limited space and legroom. Roads in St Lucia are winding and bumpy.

Min age for is 8 years old (minors must be accompanied by an adult). Max weight is 220 lbs / 113 kg.

Useful tips: wear comfortable clothing (jeans or Bermuda-length shorts are recommend), sneakers or sandals (no flip-flops), and shirts with short sleeves (no sleeveless tops). Bring a hat, insect repellent, sunscreen, a change of shirt, water and US \$ or credit card if you wish to purchase any items at the gift shop. For guests with long hair, it is suggested wearing it in a ponytail or a bun. Helmet, hairnet and gloves are provided.

SAINT LUCIA (Soufrière) – Soufrière and Tet Paul nature trail hike

Set off from Soufrière Dock for a short drive through the town before going “back to nature” during a guided hike on the Tet Paul Trail with a local nature guide. As you follow the trail through some really spectacular scenery your guide will fill you in on the island’s flora and fauna, folk remedies, local customs, history and island life, to make this not just a nature walk but a really interactive cultural experience. There will be many stunning photo opportunities and beautiful views along the way.

Make sure you bring your camera because there are so very many wonderful photo opportunities. Breath-taking sights include the majestic Pitons, two mountainous volcanic rock formations, the far away Island of St Vincent, and the lush southern side of St Lucia including Jalousie Bay. At the end of the trail there will be time to relax and enjoy some local refreshments and snacks before heading back to the Soufrière, where the ship will be waiting.

Please note: This tour must be considered strenuous and is suitable only for guest who are in very good physical conditions.

The nature trail takes you through rain forest, uneven terrain, dirt tracks, narrow paths and in some areas up fairly steep slopes. The trail may be muddy if there has been some rain and inclines are moderate to steep. There is limited shade on this excursion. The Tet Paul Nature Trail hike can take about 45 minutes to complete depending on the group’s pace.

Useful tips: wear light, comfortable clothing and appropriate hiking shoes and bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent and water. The journey between Soufriere and the nature trail takes approximately 15 minutes, on a winding and bumpy. Coasters or minibuses have small seats and limited space and legroom. Moving on from here you continue along the coast for a while with another picture stop at Bathsheba, the famous surfing spot in Barbados.

Next, stop for a refreshing drink before you drive up the hill to historic St. John’s Parish Church which offers incredible views of the picturesque East Coast. Enjoy this breathtaking scene one last time, from 800 feet above sea level. The church building and grounds are a treasure belonging to the Barbados National Trust.

From here a short drive will take you to the Airport where you will find your luggage ready to be checked in.

Please note: Luggage will be loaded on a separate luggage truck and delivered to the Airport at the end of the tour. Guests will need to retrieve them at the airport before check-in.

Useful tips: wear weather-appropriate clothes and comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat, sunscreen, and water.
