- A minimum number of participants is required for each tour; if the required number is not attained, the tour may be cancelled.
- Cancellation and changes are possible until the booking deadline. After the booking deadline, 100% cancellation fees will be charged.

PANAMA CANAL TRANSIT

A Panama Canal transit is a captivating and engineering marvel that takes ships through the heart of the Americas, connecting the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans. This extraordinary journey involves navigating a series of locks and channels, providing a front-row seat to the incredible feat of human ingenuity.

As vessels make their way through the lush tropical landscape of Panama, passengers can witness the intricate process of rising and descending through the locks, which is both educational and awe-inspiring. The experience offers a unique perspective on the country's rich history, stunning landscapes, and the vital role the canal plays in global trade and connectivity.

SAN BLAS ARCHIPELAGO - *Time at leisure (no tours organized)*

The vivid colors of the San Blas Islands are undoubtedly the inspiration for the fanciful birds, fish and animals in brilliant reds, oranges, blues and greens that decorate the intricately appliquéd molas created by the indigenous Kuna women. Strung along the throat of Panama's dramatically beautiful Kuna Yala coast, the remoteness of these coral atolls protects an independent people who prize their communal culture with its rich oral history and artistic heritage.

CARTAGENA - Cartagena, World Heritage city

Cartagena boasts a spectacular assortment of buildings and massive fortifications dating from the early 1600s and its historic town has been declared World Heritage by UNESCO. The fortresses were built to protect Cartagena from pirates.

Leave the port onboard an air-conditioned motorcoach and drive to the old town. There will be a brief photo stop at the San Felipe de Barajas fort to admire the panoramic view.

Continue by coach to "Las Bóvedas", a complex of arcades and vaults that during the colonial era it was used as barracks for the troops and to store military provisions and later on, served as a jail house. Nowadays, the cells have been converted into boutiques selling a wonderful array of Colombian merchandise and artifacts, so you will be able to do some souvenir shopping. Leave the coach and start a walking tour in the old colonial town, starting at Santiago's bastion. You will go down the ramp to San Juan de Dios Street, with its fine colonial architecture and end up at San Pedro Claver's Plaza and Church (internal visit).

The tour continues through the narrow streets and main squares of the colonial city towards Custom Plaza, which was the hub of commercial activity during the colonial era, and then on to Plaza de la Proclamación to admire the Cathedral. You will also see the Governor's building, the headquarter of the Spanish government in colonial days.

You will visit the Navy Museum, see the Inquisition Palace and admire the magnificent colonial mansions as you stroll back to the tour bus at Santiago's Bastion.

The excursion ends with a short sightseeing drive through Boca Grande on the way back to the cruise port.

Please note: This excursion involves extensive walking (approx. 1.5 hours) over uneven surfaces, with some inclines and steps.

Helpful hints: wear weather-appropriate clothes and comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat, sunscreen, and water.

Shops are normally closed on Sundays. The stop at Las Bóvedas depends on whether the shops are open.

Inside visits: San Pedro Claver church, Navy museum. The order of the visits may vary.

At the end of the tour, you will be dropped off at the cruise terminal. A free port shuttle bus will take you back to the ship.



CARTAGENA - A Taste of Cartagena

The magnificent City of Cartagena, once the treasure chest of the Spanish Main and prey to marauding pirates, is yours to explore on our “Taste of Cartagena” coach tour. Cartagena with its impressive fortress, earned the reputation of being the Spanish conquistadores most impregnable city.

In the period between the initial settlement in 1533 and independence in 1811, the “new” town developed into a prosperous urban center. An English-speaking guide will accompany you on the coach tour as you drive past some splendid examples of Republican architecture and the Manga residential area, where some of the aging mansions have been restored to their former glory. First stop will be for a photo opportunity at the Fort of San Felipe de Barajas, a 17th-century construction acknowledged to be the most important work of Spanish Military engineering in Latin America.

You will pass through Santo Domingo square and Simón Bolívar Square, then you will continue with a walking tour through the narrow streets of the Old City, on the way to the Inquisition Palace and the church of San Pedro Claver, the patron saint of slaves. During the tour you will literally be getting a taste of Cartagena, sampling some delicious traditional snacks and of course the justly famous Colombian Coffee before returning to the ship.

Please note: The order of the visits may vary. This excursion involves extensive walking /standing (3 hours approx.) over uneven surfaces, with inclines and some steps. Inside visits: San Pedro Claver church, Inquisition Palace.

Helpful hints: wear weather-appropriate clothes and comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat, sunscreen, and water.

During the tour Guests will taste tropical fruit, Colombian coffee and some local snacks and sweets at different venues.

At the end of the tour, you will be dropped off at the cruise terminal. A free port shuttle bus will take you back to the ship

CARTAGENA - Colombian coffee and premium rum tasting experience

Live a sensory experience which will offer you the possibility of tasting and enriching the flavor of an exquisite luxurious coffee together with the best premium rums in Colombia, through its ritual “Coffee Baptism”, in which coffee is paired with rum.

Your adventure begins with a scenic sightseeing trip to the Old City, including a stop for photos at historic San Felipe Fortress.

Then it's on to the main event: A deep dive into the rich flavors, aromas, and attributes of Colombian coffee and Colombian national rums. Your senses will awaken and sing as you learn to appreciate and enjoy the subtle differences between strains of coffee beans (including how they're processed) to produce this nation's signature drink and most significant export.

Search for the high and low flavor notes in various premium rums; tease out both their bold and direct flavors, and then their whispering undertones.

When you've completed this gustatory adventure, return to the ship via a leisurely sightseeing drive that reveals modern-day Cartagena and its lovely bay.

Please note: The order of the visits may vary. This excursion involves extensive walking over uneven surfaces and is not recommended to guests with reduced mobility. The venue of the experience is made on the second floor of a colonial house, which does not have elevators and has stairs.

Helpful hints: wear weather-appropriate clothes and comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat, sunscreen, and water.

At the end of the tour, you will be dropped off at the cruise terminal. A free port shuttle bus will take you back to the ship.



SANTA MARTA - Santa Marta discovery tour

During the guided city walk you will see the historical Plaza Bolivar, called “the lovers’ square”, and you will walk through the colorful and lively streets of the old town.

San Pedro de Alejandrino estate was built in the 17th century as a country estate at the gates of the city, and it was the setting for many significant events in Colombian history. In 1830 don Joaquin Mier y Benitez, offered his home to the liberator Simon Bolivar as a refuge for his last days, it was later declared a national monument by the Colombian Government, not only the interior of the house has been restored and conserved, but the many gardens has also been brought back to their former by National Tourism Corporation.

The cathedral was built in 1529, four years after the founding of Santa Marta by Fray Thomas Ortiz - a Dominican Brother - and dedicated to Saint Anne. It was the first church built on the American continent and is considered the mother of the Colombian churches. Despite its small size, it is one of the city's most outstanding sights with its bright white neoclassical facade.

The Customs House is an historical and architectural monument, that has been restored and preserved; it is now the house of the Gold Museum, an exhibit describing the customs of the pre-Colombian community, accompanied by a small yet priceless collection of Tayrona Gold and Pottery pieces (Gold Museum is closed on Mondays).

Please note: The order of the visits may vary. This excursion involves extensive walking over uneven surfaces and is not recommended to guests with reduced mobility.

Helpful hints: wear weather-appropriate clothes and comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat, sunscreen, and water.

Inside visits on this tour include the Gold Museum (except on Mondays, when the museum is closed), the Cathedral and the San Pedro de Alejandrino estate.

BONAIRE (Kralendijk) - Best of Bonaire

Your trip begins with a leisurely drive to the South/East side of the island, through one of the best-preserved mangrove areas in the Caribbean. Along the way, your guide will be on the lookout for Bonaire’s most famous bird, the shy flamingo. With its deep pink-coral feathers and graceful leggy walk, this bird is especially beautiful in the wild. Donkeys and goats like to graze beside the country roads, so you will be able to take some great photos.

At Sorobon beach, you will make a short stop to view the beautiful bay where you can dip your feet in the warm turquoise colored water. Enjoy a cool drink, refresh yourself, and then continue your trip to seek out some more flamingos!

Visit the Salt flats, home to the protected flamingo sanctuary. Here, your guide will explain how salt is produced today on Bonaire, and how it was mined by the slaves in the 19th century. At the Slave Huts, you will literally see and touch history as you enter the huts that served as shelters for the slaves working the salt pans.

On the drive back to the ship enjoy a breath-taking coastline view with pink-colored salt pans, and snow-white salt mounds on one side and the aqua-blue Caribbean Sea on the other. It’s a real live postcard!

Before arriving at the ship, you will have one last chance to see some flamingos at a salt pond.

Please note: Guests are advised to wear weather-appropriate clothes and comfortable walking shoes and to bring a hat and a bottle of water.

Get a taste of the High Life on our exclusive sailing tour. Sit back & let yourself be pampered while you enjoy a relaxed sail along the beautiful coast of Bonaire on board this unique 44ft sailing yacht.

Destination: a snorkeling paradise at the world-famous Bonaire Marine Park. All snorkel equipment is available on board and your crew will help you gear up and get into the water.

Later, the Chef will treat you to delicious freshly made snacks and an open bar of rum, beer, wine, juice & soft drinks awaits your pleasure on this exclusive sailing trip.

Please note: This tour is not suitable for guests with reduced mobility, back or neck issues and pregnant women. Half of the boat has shade. Please wear your swimsuit under your clothing and bring a towel, sunscreen, sunglasses, t-shirt and a hat.

Snorkeling is optional, Guests participating to the snorkeling must be experienced swimmers. Snorkelling equipment is provided. Rum punch will be served only after the snorkeling.

Footwear restricted to rubber shoes, sneakers or sandals. There is a 15-minute drive to reach the boat from the pier.

BONAIRE (Kralendjik) - Mangrove Kayaking

The drive from the pier to the mangrove area, Lac Bay, takes approximately 25 minutes.

This area is a designated National Park and visitors must be accompanied by a trained guide. Experience the tranquil beauty of the mangroves as you glide past bird habitats and fish spawning grounds. Your guide will enhance the tour with brief explanations on the interrelation between plants and animals, without in any way disturbing the peace of the mangroves with a running commentary.

The “Sit on Top” Ocean Kayaks with their adjustable back rests are quite comfortable and easy to maneuver through the shallow waters.

Please note: This is a very active tour and is only recommended for guests in very good physical condition. Participants must be able to swim. Minimum age is 10 years old (minors must be accompanied by an adult). Max weight is 440 lbs / 200 kg per kayak (double kayaks will be used).

No guests with heart conditions, asthma, walking disabilities, leg injuries, chest injuries and/or recovering from surgery should participate in this tour. Neither should pregnant women.

Please wear a swimsuit under your clothes and bring towel, sunscreen, sunglasses, insect repellent, hat, water shoes, sunglasses, insect repellent and t-shirt (if sun sensitive). Waterproof cameras are highly recommended.

Refreshments in the form of juice, soda or water will be provided. Before the tour starts, practical instructions on how to maneuver the kayaks will be given.

The kayak tour lasts approx. 2 / 2.5 hours, depending on the group’s pace. Under normal circumstances the kayaks are extremely stable, however it is possible to tip them over.

Head towards Klein Bonaire, a haven for some of the most breathtaking coral reefs and marine life in the region. Immerse yourself in a world of color as you marvel at the vibrant coral formations and captivating marine creatures that call this underwater paradise home.

Please note: This tour is not suitable for guests with reduced mobility, back or neck issues and pregnant women.

Please wear your swimsuit under your clothing and bring a towel, sunscreen, sunglasses, t-shirt and a hat.

Guests participating to the snorkeling must know how to swim. Snorkelling equipment is provided (masks, snorkels and fins). A selection of soft drinks and water is available onboard (included in the excursion).

CURAÇAO (Willemstad) - Curaçao country drive tour

On this wonderful tour you will see the beauties of the island's nature. We leave the port and we drive to the west passing through some areas of the city before arriving at the countryside. On the way to our first stop you will see several plantation homes and old labor houses.

Our first stop will be the old labor house "Kas di Pal'i Maishi. Here your guide will explain to you in an entertaining way about the life on Curaçao in the old days. They will demonstrate what they did with the abundant available cactus plants, they will sing a song and show you a typical local dance.

Boka Tabla is our second stop which is one of the national parks on the island. Here you will see how the wild sea meets the coast in a spectacular way. The waves are exploding on wild rock formations. Especially the power of the sea will amaze you and the unpredictable waves are stunning.

At West Point we have a small photo stop from the bus, where you can enjoy the beautiful view over the Caribbean Sea at Playa Forti. The next stop is the most beautiful tropical beach on the island, with its unforgettable azure blue sea and white beach. You can see the tropical fish swimming through the crystal-clear sea. This is the most perfect place for making your tropical vacation photos.

On our way back we will pass by the salt lakes of Jan Kok, where you might be lucky to spot some Flamingo's, before we drive straight back to the ship.

Please note: This tour involves moderate walking over uneven surfaces.

Helpful hints: weather-appropriate clothes and comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat, sunscreen and water.

The tour consists in a panoramic tour of the island by bus with several visits and photo stops.



CURAÇAO (Willemstad) - Beach hop and turtle snorkeling adventure

Curaçao is known for its beautiful and exclusive beaches. Crystal clear blue waters and sweet, warm sea air will inspire you to explore the island’s captivating shores. From the ship we drive you through the countryside of the island to Playa Grandi, a natural beach at the most Western point of the island.

Here you will have a chance to get to know a part of the marine park of our island and possibly spot turtles at this particular spot. Together with your guide, you will discover the beauties of the Caribbean Sea. It is great fun to snorkel and to explore the amazing and stunning underwater world of Curaçao. This underwater Marine Park has so much to offer, like numerous multi-colored tropical fish and a very good chance to swim around some turtles that frequently visit this beach.

After a short drive we will bring you to Cas Abao Beach. Here you will be able to go snorkeling again or relax at your beach chair. Your snorkel guide will assist you and help you recognize the beautiful fish that surround you.

After this fantastic snorkeling experience, we bring you back to the ship again.

Please note: Shower, beach chair and one drink (soda) are included in stop at Cas Abao Beach, while there are no facilities at Playa Grandi. Beach can be rocky (dead coral) which can make entering the sea a bit more difficult. Slight currents can occur, could be windy and sometimes there are waves.

Helpful hints: wear a swimsuit under your clothes and bring sunscreen, a hat, sunglasses, water, aqua shoes and a towel from the ship. Mask, snorkel, and snorkel vest are provided. The use of fins is not allowed (their movement can frighten the turtles).

Approximate driving times: pier to Playa Grandi: 45 minutes. Playa Grandi to Cas Abao beach: 30 minutes. Cas Abao beach to the pier: 30 minutes. Transfers can either be in open beach bus or air-conditioned coach.

CURAÇAO (Willemstad) - Seaworld Explorer

The Seaworld Explorer is a state-of-the-art air-conditioned semi-submarine originally used for research on Australia great’s barrier reef. The vessel always remains above sea level and accommodate his passengers comfortably in its hull, which sits 5 feet below the surface. Huge glass windows provide spectacular views of the many different varieties of corals and fish which Curacao is famous for.

In fact, the fish come right up to your window, making it easy to snap that memorable photo. Board the Seaworld Explorer semi-submarine and sit in air-conditioned comfort five feet below the surface of the water. View sea life through large windows and enjoy the dramatic effect of passing over a wall that drops sharply several hundred feet. See tropical fish such as yellowtail snapper, sergeant majors, parrotfish, and queen angelfish, as well as delicate colonies of coral. Watch through your private window as a diver is surrounded by hungry fish that he feeds by hand.

Please note: Seaworld Explorer is fully airconditioned and certified by the Dutch Shipping Inspector.

Guests must be able to safely navigate 10 steps into and out of the hull of Seaworld Explorer.

There are 15 minutes transfer by van to the Seaworld Explorer basis, you will spend approximately 50 minutes on the semi-submarine.



CURAÇAO (Willemstad) - Colorful Willemstad and Maritime Museum

Begin your tour walking through the historic Rif Fort, cross the harbor on the floating Queen Emma Bridge. Continue your walk by passing vibrant merchant houses on the quay of the harbor. Continue to Fort Amsterdam, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, built in 1634 to guard the entrance of the harbor. This citadel was converted into the Governor's Palace and the office of the Central Government of Curacao.

Arrive at the Curacao Maritime Museum for a (approx. 1 hour) guided tour. The museum is vested in an old colonial two storied mansion built in 1729. After this building was completely burned down in 1988, it was spectacularly restored. The interior is designed in maritime style, complete with gangplank, portholes, and ship railings.

The Curacao Maritime Museum harmoniously embraces the age-old maritime history of the island. The storyline is illustrated through authentic nautical charts, ship models and navigation equipment combined with modern day audiovisual techniques. All sorts of interesting details of the Curacao Maritime history are revered.

After the tour at the Curacao Maritime Museum, we will stop for a refreshment before making our way back to the ship walking around the Riffort shopping area. Guests can either choose to return to the pier or remain in town and explore independently.

Please note: This tour involves extended walking (approx. 3 km) and standing over uneven surfaces.

Helpful hints: weather-appropriate clothes and comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat, sunscreen and water.

Experience the beauties of Natural Aruba on a tour that takes you on a journey of discovery. You will first make the scenic trip to Aruba's number one ecological attraction, The Butterfly Farm. The farm is an unforgettable encounter with nature in all its diversity. Step into a tropical garden teeming with butterflies and prepare to meet some of the world's most colorful and unusual creatures.

From the Butterfly Farm you will journey to the Ayo Rock Formation where you can explore the natural gardens and walk amongst huge boulders.

Travelling on, you will pass countless Divi Divi trees and cactus before arriving at a natural bridge carved by the relentless pounding of the surf. You will also see the ruins of a much larger natural bridge which collapsed in 2005.

The excursion ends with the scenic drive to Oranjestad, the capital of Aruba.

Please note: This tour involves moderate walking over uneven surfaces.

ARUBA (Oranjestad) - Offroad adventure in Aruba and beach stop

Your adventure begins with a scenic drive over the Casibari Rock Formation, your local driver-guide will share his knowledge of the many sights you'll visit. Next stop are the Natural Bridge Ruins and Baby Natural Bridge. Pounded over thousands of years by wind and surf, this natural coral limestone bridge is a testament to nature's power. Then, continue the drive along the east coast, until you arrive to Alto Vista Chapel and the California Lighthouse. Before returning to the ship, there will be a 45-minute stop at one of the best beaches of the island with crystalline waters. After having enjoyed time at leisure at the beach, a bus will pick you up for your return back to the ship.

Please note: Vehicles are driven by professional driver-guides and each vehicle can accommodate 8 or 16 passengers. Parking lot at the port is located at 5 to 10 minutes' walk from the pier. Minimum age to participate is 6 years old. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility, pregnant women or anyone suffering from conditions (back, neck or other) which may be affected by bumpy roads. Helpful hints: wear weather-appropriate clothes and comfortable walking shoes and to bring a hat, sunscreen and water. For the stop at the beach, wear a swimsuit under their clothes and to bring a towel from the ship and sunscreen

ARUBA (Oranjestad) - Atlantis Submarine Tour

The adventure begins with a short transfer to the submarine on board our shuttle vessel Sub Seeker. The submarine is located just off the southeast coast of Aruba, waiting to take you on a thrilling dive to the mysterious sunken airplane or the former Danish sailboat "Mi Dushi 1", as well as seeing "The Morgenste", a recently sunk coaster. The submarine dives down to depths of 120 ft (36 mt) and offers close up views of exotic marine life: schools of brightly colored tropical fish, huge sponge gardens and the enchanting beauty of the coral fields. Our professional crew will provide an informative and entertaining commentary throughout the tour. The Atlantis Submarine Tour is a truly unique experience. A close encounter with the underwater world from the air-conditioned comfort of a US Coastguard approved submarine.

Please note: Participants must be able to negotiate a 12-step ladder into and out of the submarine. Minimum age to participate is 4 years old, minimum height is 90 cm. Depending on the docking spot, there is a 5-to-10-minute walk to reach the Sub Seeker. The dive itself lasts 45 minutes. The submarine might not be exclusive for SC guests.



GRENADA (St George’s) - Catamaran sailing and snorkeling tour

From St. George’s Harbor, you will sail on a catamaran along Grenada’s west coast to stop at Molinere Bay. Here you will enjoy a snorkeling stop to discover the underwater sculpture park, located in Granada’s marine protected area. These statues are sympathetically located to enhance the reef, making natural use of its varied topography. Then you will sail to Mango Bay beach (wet landing) for a second stop before a one-hour sailing back to the cruise terminal. Unlimited beverages are provided throughout, including rum punch, juices, and mineral water.

Please note: This tour is not suitable for guests with reduced mobility, back or neck issues and pregnant women. Guests must walk in ankle-deep water to (dis)embark to boat at Mango Bay. Snorkeling is optional, Guests participating to the snorkeling must be experienced swimmers. Half of the boat has shade. Unlimited beverages are provided throughout including rum punch (only after the snorkeling), juices and mineral water. Mask, snorkel, and snorkel vest are provided (no fins). Helpful hints: wear your swimsuit under a cover-up and bring a towel, sunscreen, sunglasses, aqua shoes and a hat.

GRENADA (St George’s) - Chocolate and falls

This aromatic island tour will allow you to know everything about the “Jouvay” organic chocolate production at the Diamond Chocolate Factory nestled in the village of Victoria on the west coast of Grenada. You’ll find it in an 18th-century converted rum distillery, which was built by French monks. Nowadays, the factory’s responsible for making “Jouvay” – one of the world’s top 10 chocolates, according to National Geographic. This chocolate’s completely organic and you’ll learn how it’s made – from the harvest of the cocoa beans, to watching them dry on trays under the Caribbean sun.

A visit to the garden of cocoa trees to see, cocoa, cloves, chili, nutmeg, flowers, fruits, followed by a delicious chocolate tasting, will conclude this pleasant visit to one of the most amazing sites in the Caribbean. Next, proceed for a visit to Concord Fall, where nutmeg and cocoa trees grow along the flanks of the hills in the tropical forest. Upon arrival, relax with a complementary drink and take a refreshing swim in the lovely natural waterfall-pool (Conditions permitting). Following your visit, commence the approximately 45-minute drive back to the cruise terminal.

Please note: Guests will get the opportunity to swim at the waterfall site. The water at the waterfall is not crystal clear at all times especially when it rains, however, it is safe to swim or take a quick dip. Terrain at the waterfall is uneven and may be slippery. Helpful hints: wear a swimsuit under your clothes and bring sunscreen, a hat, sunglasses, a towel from the ship and water. The tour sequence may vary. There’s not visit inside the chocolate factory. The drive from St George’s to the Chocolate factory will take 1h20 minutes, on a winding road.



GRENADA (St George’s) - Trek to Bamboo Fall

This excursion is a must for all Nature lovers; it is a wonderful journey of discovery starting at St George’s and following steep winding roads culminating at the rain forest peak, an amazing spot some 1900ft above sea level. This is Grand Etang Forest, a sanctuary and nature reserve located in the islands Central Mountain Range. Here lush vegetation, towering mahogany trees, ferns and colourful tropical flowers provide a vivid background to a wide cross section of bird and animal life. If you enjoy trekking, then you will love the trail through the rainforest to reach Bamboo falls. The trek will take you over a private plantation where you will see nutmeg, cocoa, bananas, and many other vibrant tropical plants. It can be muddy and slippery, especially if it has rained recently, so please choose your footwear accordingly. Bamboo Falls is known as one of the most famous and beautiful Grenada’s waterfalls and is certainly worth the 30-minute trek to get there.

Fresh local organic orange juice will be available on your return to the Cruise Terminal.

Enjoy unspoilt nature at its finest and join us on this unforgettable Eco trek.

Please note: This tour must be considered strenuous and is suitable only for guest who are in very good physical conditions. Rain Forest terrain is muddy and can be slippery. Before arriving to the fall guests must cross a river and have feet up to the knees into the water.

Helpful hints: wear light clothes and comfortable hiking shoes (closed shoes with grip) and bring a hat, sunscreen, and water.

Guests who wish to swim at the waterfall are advised to wear a swimsuit under a cover-up and bring aqua shoes.

The drive from the ship to the start of the trail takes approximately 45 minutes each way, on a winding and bumpy road.

SAINT LUCIA (Soufrière bay) - Natural attractions of La Soufrière

Drive through the town of Soufrière, bypassing the town square and the Cathedral, and reach the Sulphur Springs park, known as the Caribbean’s, only drive-in volcano. The roads lead you right up to the remnants of a volcanic crater; a moonscape of barren earth and gravel where pools of muddy water bubble and belch out clouds of steam and a smell of sulphur pervades the atmosphere.

Your journey will continue to the Soufriere Estate’s Diamond Botanical Gardens, Waterfall & Mineral Baths. Established in 1745, it is one of the oldest estates on the island.

Admire the tropical plants along the pathway and the magnificent waterfall before getting back on the bus.

After a short drive you will arrive at a restaurant nestled on the hillside, that affords a spectacular view of the Pitons, two majestic twin peaks soaring out of the sea at Soufrière Bay which have come to be a symbol of the Saint Lucia. Be sure to have your cameras at the ready for a splendid photo opportunity, while you enjoy a complementary local rum or fruit punch while relaxing on the verandah. The tour ends with a short drive down to the port, where your ship awaits.

Please note: Guests are advised to wear weather-appropriate clothes and comfortable walking shoes and to bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent, water and USD if they wish to purchase a small souvenir.

SAINT LUCIA (Soufrière bay) - Zip line ride at Morne Coubaril Estate

This excursion combines a short sightseeing tour with the adrenaline rush of zipping under the sheer Petit Piton, with breathtaking views of the historic town of Soufrière and the Caribbean Sea.

Depart ship and take a short drive through the rustic town of Soufrière up to the Morne Coubaril Estate in Soufrière. Take a guided tour of this working plantation and the gardens well stocked with the plants and flowers indigenous to the island.

Your guide will lead you up the estate driveway to manioc house where you will learn how cassava bread is made, you will learn about the process of de-husking a coconut and oven drying copra, before sampling some coconut water and jelly. Taste a ripe cocoa bean at the cocoa and coffee house before seeing the process of fermentation and bean drying, and the cocoa dance used to polish the dried beans. See the mule-driven sugar cane mill and enjoy some delicious fresh cane juice.

After the guided tour, you will be equipped with harness, helmet and gloves and be given a safety briefing and training demonstration before setting off on your zip line adventure.

The zip line offers a total immersion in the natural environment and panoramic view of the bay and the awe-inspiring Pitons. Eight zip cables move you effortlessly through the estate, before being carried into a canopy of banyan, coconut, plum and mango trees and across a bamboo-shadowed gorge. After your zip line adventure, you will enjoy some refreshment at a local restaurant close to the gift shop, before you return to the port.

Please note: This tour is only for Guest who are in very good physical conditions and it is not suitable for guests with fear of height, pregnant women, persons with heart or respiratory conditions. Participants will have to sign a waiver.

Coasters or minibuses have small seats and limited space and legroom. Roads in St Lucia are winding and bumpy.

Set off from Soufrière Dock for a short drive through the town before going “back to nature” during a guided hike on the Tet Paul Trail with a local nature guide. As you follow the trail through some really spectacular scenery your guide will fill you in on the island’s flora and fauna, folk remedies, local customs, history and island life, to make this not just a nature walk but a really interactive cultural experience. There will be many stunning photo opportunities and beautiful views along the way.

Make sure you bring your camera because there are so very many wonderful photo opportunities. Breath-taking sights include the majestic Pitons, two mountainous volcanic rock formations, the far away Island of St Vincent, and the lush southern side of St Lucia including Jalousie Bay.

At the end of the trail there will be time to relax and enjoy some local refreshments and snacks before heading back to the Soufrière, where the ship will be waiting.

Please note: This tour must be considered strenuous and is suitable only for guest who are in very good physical conditions.

The nature trail takes you through rain forest, uneven terrain, dirt tracks, narrow paths and in some areas up fairly steep slopes. The trail may be muddy if there has been some rain and inclines are moderate to steep. There is limited shade on this excursion.

The Tet Paul Nature Trail hike can take about 45 minutes to complete depending on the group’s pace.

Useful tips: wear light, comfortable clothing and appropriate hiking shoes and bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent and water. A refreshment will be served after the hiking.

The journey between Soufriere and the nature trail takes approximately 15 minutes, on a winding and bumpy. Coasters or minibuses have small seats and limited space and legroom. Roads in St Lucia are.

You will discover the history of the island and the customs of its inhabitants through permanent and temporary exhibitions highlighting the history and the cultural identity of the Creoles. At the end of the visit, take part in a cocoa workshop before enjoying a tasting of hot chocolate.

Please note: This tour is not recommended for guests with walking difficulties; it involves walking on uneven terrain.

Leave the port of St. John's and drive through the interior of the islands to the south coast. Passing small villages you will reach Shirley Heights, the southernmost point of Antigua. Shirley Heights Fort was built by the British on a 150m-height promontory, to protect their fleet stationed at English Harbor. This historic military lookout offers some of the most spectacular views of the island, with panoramic vistas of the English Harbour, the Caribbean Sea and surrounding mountains. You can explore the ruins of the military buildings and learn about the site's fascinating history.

Next stop will be at Nelson Dockyard, a beautifully preserved 18th-century British naval base that has been restored. Named after Admiral Lord Horatio Nelson, the dockyard was built in 1725 to serve as a base for ships which patrolled the waters of the West Indies to ensure British maritime supremacy.

This UNESCO World Heritage site is fully open to the public and visitors can explore the old buildings, including the naval officer's quarters, the workshops, and the warehouses. After a short tour of the historic harbor, you can enjoy a light lunch at the charming Copper and Lumber Hotel, built in a Georgian architecture style. After lunch, drive across the island to reach the international airport.

Please note: Luggage will be loaded on a separate luggage truck and delivered to the Airport at the end of the tour. Guests will need to retrieve them at the airport before check-in.

This excursion involves moderate walking over uneven surfaces (approx. 2 km, with some steps to negotiate).
