

What you need to know before booking your shore excursion:

- All our tours are offered with English speaking guides.
- The length of the tours and time spent on the sites is given as an indication as it may vary depending on weather, sea and traffic conditions and on the group's pace.
- The level of physical fitness required for our activities is given as a very general indication. Passengers should be fit and active to join tours which include hiking, biking, snorkelling, boating, or similar activities.

How you can book your shore excursions:

- You can book shore excursions onboard, using our "sign-up lists" available at the Cruise Director's desk.
- Debark tours ending at the airport and transfers can now be pre-booked prior your cruise.
- In order to provide the best service and to avoid disappointments, please book your shore excursions as early as possible: places are limited and there is a booking deadline for each port.
- A minimum number of participants is required for tours; if the required number is not attained, the tour may be cancelled.

Important notes:

- Departure times of the tour are mentioned on the daily program of each port.
- The Captain reserves the right to alter the itinerary in order to suit wind, weather and local conditions.
- Cancellation and changes are possible until the booking deadline. After the booking deadline, 100 % cancellation fees will be charged.
- All information concerning excursions is correct at the time of printing. However, Star Clippers reserves the right to make changes, which will be relayed to passengers during the Cruise Director's onboard information sessions. Last updated tour descriptions are available in a file at the Cruise Director's desk.

LES SAINTES (Terre-de-Haut)

A cluster of eight small islands, Les Saintes lies just six miles off the southern coast of Guadeloupe. Only two of the islands, Terre-de-Haut and Terre-de-Bas, attract any tourists, as the other six islands are little more than rocky outcrops. The locals are primarily fishermen, known for their large boats and unique head gear. Les Saintes have acquired a well-deserved reputation for beautiful beaches and reefs and attract divers from around the world. Happily though, mass tourism is unknown here and the charm of these enchanted isles remains unspoiled. The tender will take you to the tiny capital "Le Bourg", a charmingly picturesque seaside village.

LES SAINTES (Terre-de-Haut) - Speed boat tour and snorkel in Les Saintes bay

Duration: 03:00 approx. Transportation: speed boat Price: 105 € Activity level: moderate

Min 8 / Max 12 participants

Experience the beauty of the Les Saints Archipelago from a unique perspective during this panoramic sightseeing and snorkeling guided journey by speed boat.

Sail along the beautiful bay, passing by Ilet Cabrit, Terre de Bas, Ilet Redonde, Grand Ilet, Ilet de la Coche, Ilets Les Augustins. Then stop for a guided snorkeling session in the warm, crystal-clear waters nearest Pain de Sucre.

Please note: This tour is not suitable for guests with reduced mobility, back or neck issues and pregnant women.

Snorkeling is optional, Guests participating to the snorkeling must know how to swim. Mask, snorkel, and snorkel vest are provided (No fins). Please wear aqua shoes and your swimsuit under your clothing and bring a towel, sunscreen, sunglasses and a hat. Min age for participating in this excursion is 7 years old (minors must be accompanied by an adult).

Max weight for participating in this excursion is 220 lbs/100 kg.

LES SAINTES (Terre-de-Haut) - Clear-bottom kayak at Pain de Sucre and relax at the beach

Duration: 03:30 approx. Transportation: mororboat Price: 79 € Activity level: strenuous

Min 10 / Max 12 participants

Explore the pristine turquoise waters of Les Saintes during an eco-friendly excursion, aboard a clear-bottom kayak.

With a short transfer by boat go to the Kayaking-base.

After a safety-briefing, begin your guided kayaking tour with your instructor along the most beautiful spot: Le Pain de Sucre.

Paddle along the crystal-clear waters, see the exquisite seabed, tropical fishes and marine life.

At your return to the base, relax at the beach before you go back to the pier by boat.

At the beach resort, a refreshment will be offered and beach chair, paddle, step paddle and snorkel equipment will be at disposal at the beach (at no extra fee).

Please note: Participants must be able to swim. This is a very active tour and is only recommended for guests in very good physical condition. No guests with heart conditions, asthma, walking disabilities, leg injuries, chest injuries and/or recovering from surgery should participate in this tour. Neither should pregnant women.

Min age for participating in this excursion is 9 years old (minors must be accompanied by an adult).

Max height for participating in this excursion in 6.5 feet/2 meters.

Max weight for participating in this excursion is 220 lbs/100 kg.

Kayaks have 2 places. Before the tour starts, practical instructions on how to maneuver the kayaks will be given.

The kayak tour lasts approx. 1 hours, depending on the group's pace.

At the beach resort, after the kayak tour a refreshment will be offered. Beach chair, paddle, step paddle and snorkel equipment will be at disposal at the beach (at no extra fee).



DOMINICA (Cabrits)

Christopher Columbus discovered this island on a Sunday, hence the name Dominica. Little has changed since that fateful day and it is said that if Columbus were to visit the Caribbean today, this is the only island he would recognize. Contemporary visitors will find an island that is unspoiled and rich in natural beauty. The only characteristic Dominica shares with its Caribbean counterparts is that the French and the British fought for control of the island. The British finally succeeded and controlled the island until it was granted full independence in 1978. The similarity with its neighbors ends there. Dominica is 29 miles long and 16 miles wide and does not conform to the typical image of a Caribbean island. It is lush with mountains and few beaches and no over developed tourist spots. The whole atmosphere of Dominica centers on its forest landscape. The mountain ranges stretch from one end of the island to the other, averaging 3000 feet and peaking as high as 5000 feet. The mountains provide not only a geographical backbone, but an ecological one as well. Their sides are covered with dense rain forests and foliage and spawn some 365 rivers and streams with numerous waterfalls and natural pools. Dominica is a real island paradise with a natural beauty all its own.

DOMINICA - The Indian River Rowboat

Duration: 02:30 approx. Transportation: minibus, rowboat

Situated in the center of the town of Portsmouth to the North of Dominica, the Indian River is like a mini-Amazon teeming with life. It owes its name to the Kalinago people, formerly known as Carib Indians, who settled on its upper banks.

The river gushes down the Morne aux Diables mountain range and then meanders gently to the lowlands of Portsmouth where it flows into the Caribbean Sea. As it is below sea level, the water in the lower parts of the river is brackish giving rise to a unique ecosystem of flora and fauna. Some of the species, which include herons, kingfishers, and iguanas, are only to be found in this particular area of Dominica. Many of which are still present after the passing of devastating hurricane Maria. Vegetation continues to grow up and return in full force.

Experienced boatmen will take the oars and row you along the river in slow moving wooden boats so that you can appreciate the great variety of wildlife and plants on the riverbank at your leisure.

See for yourself the places where scenes from "Pirates of the Caribbean" were filmed. Upriver, you will get off the boat for a while to take a short 10-minute stroll through the botanical gardens and visit the renowned 'Bush Bar'. Try the signature rum punch, aptly named "Dynamite", a singularly potent brew. There is lots to see so don't forget to take your camera.

Afterwards you will get back into the rowing boat for a trip down river where you will board your buses and return to the ship.

Please note: There is a 15-minute drive between the port and the Indian Rivier, with a driver-guide. River local guides will take over your driver guide on the rowboat. The boat trip will be preceded by a security briefing. Rowboats can accommodate 8 passengers. You will spend approx. one hour up and down on the river. Guests are advised to bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent and water.

DOMINICA - Love & Chocolate

Duration: 03:00 approx. Transportation: minibus Price: 69 € Activity level: easy

Min 6 / Max 15 participants

Love and Chocolate have been synonymous since time immemorial. This excursion will take you to an island paradise where Love and Chocolate and love of chocolate are inextricably entwined.

Enjoy a scenic tour of the island in air-conditioned comfort as you head towards your destination: the Pointe Baptiste Estate, located near Calibishie Village. The estate is a private domain stretching over 25 acres. There is a historical guesthouse from 1930, a chocolate factory with a cottage above it and magnificent gardens filled with flowers.

It all began with a love story between two Once upon a time two British aristocrats, Lennox Napier and Elma Gordon Cumming met and fell in love. They discovered Dominica in 1931 when on a Caribbean cruise, they moved there the following year and settled near Calibishie, building a house they named Pointe Baptiste in the midst of inaccessible virgin forest.

Their grandson grew up at Pointe Baptiste but also spent time in England and France where he developed a passion for fine chocolate. Back to Dominca, he decided to study the art of chocolate to produce locally fine chocolate, building a few drying



racks and making a small quantity of 80% dark chocolate from cocoa beans grown on the estate.

Although his original intention was just to make some high-quality chocolate for his own personal consumption, through word of mouth his reputation grew, and people would knock on his door and ask to buy some.

Nowadays the Chocolate factory is a small family run business; the cocoa beans are grown and harvested on the Pointe Baptiste estate using ecologically sound, sustainable practices.

Find out about chocolate making and discover the inimitable taste of this gourmet chocolate: dark chocolate (60%, 80 %, 90% or even 100% pure cocoa beans) flavored with Ginger, Coffee, Spice (Nutmeg, Cinnamon & Cloves), Hot Pepper, Lemongrass, Tangerine, Mint and Milk chocolate. Each guest will be given a bar of chocolate of their choice and can of course purchase chocolate truffles or cocoa nibs.

This excursion also includes a tour of the flower garden, one of the most beautiful in Dominica with a wide variety of mature trees, flowers, orchids and medicinal plants. The air is heavy with the scent of Jasmin, Ylang-ylang and Frangipani trees and it is a veritable paradise for birds, butterflies and nature lovers.

After the tour there will be time for some refreshments before returning to the ship.

Please note: Guests are advised to wear comfortable walking shoes and to bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent and water. Driving time is approximately 45 minutes (each way, on a winding road) between Cabrits and Pointe Baptiste.

DOMINICA - Syndicate National Park nature trail

Duration: 03:30 approx. Transportation: minibus Price: 55 € Activity level: strenuous

Min 10 / Max 40 participants

Your Excursion begins with a short, air-conditioned drive through the town of Portsmouth passing by the scenic Indian River up to the Syndicate National Park in the Northern Forest Reserve.

Your trained Forest Guide will then join you and lead you on a comprehensive hike on the Nature Trail, approximately 2000 ft. (600 mt) above sea level, narrating in detail the existing flora and fauna and exotic bird life within this Forest Reserve.

This Reserve is exclusive in that it is the last remaining habitat where one of the endemic National Birds, the Sisserou and the Jaco Parrot can be found. The Sisserou has been relocated to a bird sanctuary off island until most vegetation has returned. At the end of your bird watching tour, you will continue to the Syndicate Resource center for refreshments. Your tour then proceeds back to the ship.

Please note: Guests are advised to wear comfortable walking shoes and to bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent and water. The walk is approx. 1.5 hours at a gentle pace. Driving time is approximately 45 minutes (each way) between Cabrits and the Syndicate National Park, with a driver-guide.

GRANDE ANSE D'ARLET BEACH (MARTINIQUE)

MARTINIQUE (Grande Anse d'Arlet) - Explore the South of Martinique

Duration: 04:30 approx. Transportation: air-conditioned minibus

Price: 69 € Activity level: moderate

Min 15 / Max 40 participants

Discover the south part of Martinique for an authentic tour that will offer you the most beautiful views, from a pottery village to a distillery through the unmissable Diamond Rock. Take in art, history, architecture, culture, and natural beauty during your time in Martinique.

The tour starts with the small town of Anses d'Arlet, famous for its pretty traditional Creole houses covered with scale-tiled roofs. Facing the large pontoon with its bell tower, Saint-Henri church became an iconic view of the island.

Drive along the coastal road to a viewpoint overlooking Diamond Rock (Rocher du Diamant), another iconic sight in Martinique. After a photo you will head to Cap 110, a memorial erected in memory of slavery. This Memorial consists of 15 busts of 2.5 meters in height arranged triangularly, to represent the slavery trade triangle between Americas, Europe and Africa.

After that we will make a stop at the local market in Le Diamant village, where you will discover local fruits, spices and much



more!

You cannot have had the full experience of Martinique without sampling their famous rum! Your final stop will be at Trois Rivieres Rum Distillery, you will learn about their special white and aged vintage rums that have been on the market since 1976.

The last stop will be at the famous "pottery village" located on a former Jesuit Monastery near Les Trois Ilets.

You will have approx. 40 minutes to visit the "Village de la Poterie" and discover the workshops of skilled craftsmen and artists, see their creations and maybe you pick up a great souvenir to take back home.

Please note: Guests are advised to wear weather-appropriate clothes and comfortable walking shoes and to bring a hat, sunscreen, and water.

Roads are winding, so this is not the ideal tour for guests suffering from motion sickness.

GRENADA (St George's)

Grenada, "the spice island", has more spice per square mile than any other place in the world. The island is fragrant with cocoa, nutmeg, cloves, ginger and vanilla, to name but a few. Despite the abundance of such crops, Grenada is very diverse in its general make-up. The island is volcanic in origin and boasts lush mountains, rain forests, volcanic crater lakes, mangroves, beautiful beaches and delicate coral reefs. Grenada's history is similar to its neighbors. Columbus discovered it in 1498 and named it Conception. However, its lush green hills were so evocative of Andalusia that Spanish sailors, no doubt yearning for their homeland, changed the name to Granada. The French and British battled for the island for almost 100 years before it was eventually ceded to the British in 1783. Grenada achieved independence in 1974. Several years later an attempt was made to establish a Communist state, which ended in the famed invasion of 1983. Although Grenada does cater heavily to tourism, there is a strong push to maintain the natural environment with one-sixth of the island's land devoted to parks and nature sanctuaries.

GRENADA - Chocolate and falls

This aromatic island tour will allow you to know everything about the "Jouvay" organic chocolate production at the Diamond Chocolate Factory nestled in the village of Victoria on the west coast of Grenada. You'll find it in an 18th-century converted rum distillery, which was built by French monks. Nowadays, the factory's responsible for making "Jouvay" – one of the world's top 10 chocolates, according to National Geographic. This chocolate's completely organic and you'll learn how it's made – from the harvest of the cocoa beans, to watching them dry on trays under the Caribbean sun.

A visit to the garden of cocoa trees to see, cocoa, cloves, chili, nutmeg, flowers, fruits, followed by a delicious chocolate tasting, will conclude this pleasant visit to one of the most amazing sites in the Caribbean.

Next, proceed for a visit to Concord Fall, where nutmeg and cocoa trees grow along the flanks of the hills in the tropical forest. Upon arrival, relax with a complementary drink and take a refreshing swim in the lovely natural waterfall-pool (Conditions permitting). Following your visit, commence the approximately 45-minute drive back to the cruise terminal.

Please note: Guests are advised to wear weather-appropriate clothes and comfortable hiking shoes (terrain at the waterfall may be slippery) and to bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent, a towel, water and USD if they wish to purchase souvenirs. Guests will get the opportunity to swim at the waterfall site and are advised to wear a swimsuit under a cover-up. The tour sequence may vary. There's not visit inside the chocolate factory. The drive from The Carenage (St George's) to the Chocolate factory will take 1h20 minutes.



GRENADA - Trek to Bamboo Fall

Duration: 04:00 approx.Transportation: minibusPrice: 49 €Activity level: strenuousMin 20 / Max 60 participantsWith driver-guide

This excursion is a must for all Nature lovers; it is a wonderful journey of discovery starting at St George's and following steep winding roads culminating at the rain forest peak, an amazing spot some 1900ft above sea level. This is Grand Etang Forest, a sanctuary and nature reserve located in the islands Central Mountain Range. Here lush vegetation, towering mahogany trees, ferns and colourful tropical flowers provide a vivid background to a wide cross section of bird and animal life. If you enjoy trekking, then you will love the trail through the rainforest to reach Bamboo falls. The trek will take you over a private plantation where you will see nutmeg, cocoa, bananas, and many other vibrant tropical plants. It can be muddy and slippery, especially if it has rained recently, so please choose your footwear accordingly. Bamboo Falls is known as one of the most famous and beautiful Grenada's waterfalls and is certainly worth the 30-minute trek to get there. Fresh local organic orange juice will be available on your return to the Cruise Terminal.

Please note: This tour must be considered strenuous and is recommended only for guest who are in very good physical conditions. Minimum age for participating in the excursion: 8 yrs old. Rain Forest terrain is muddy and can be slippery. Before arriving to the fall guests must cross a river and have feet up to the knees into the water.

Guests are advised to wear light clothes and comfortable hiking shoes (closed shoes with grip) and to bring a hat, sunscreen, a towel from the ship, insect repellent and water. Guests will get the opportunity to swim at the waterfall site and are advised to wear a swimsuit under a cover-up.

The drive from the ship to the start of the trail takes approximately 45 minutes each way.

TOBAGO CAYS (Petit Rameau)

Tobago Cays is comprised of four virtually deserted small islets within Horseshoe Reef. These islets are enormously appealing for those who love underwater exploration. Tobago Cays is a national park with some of the best snorkeling and diving in the world. Divers can glide over the dramatic natural architecture of Horseshoe Reef with its swirling shades of blue, gold, brown, turquoise and green shimmering beneath the surface. There are picnic and camp sites and beautiful protected anchorages for an overnight yacht stop.

TOBAGO CAYS - Discover the Southern Grenadines by sailing catamaran

Duration: 03:00 approx. Transportation: catamaran Price: 75 € Activity level: moderate

Min 20 / Max 50 participants

Cruise through the crystal blue waters and sparkling white sand beaches of the Marine National Park of Tobago Cays. Our first stop is at the Horseshoe Reef for snorkeling and swimming then on to view the exclusive Palm Island Resort. This will be followed by a rum punch and swim stop at the sparkling white sand beach of Mayreau, Salt Whistle, one of the top 10 beaches in the Caribbean. Swim and snorkel as much as you want on this truly memorable tour. You will be back at the beach for the ship's barbecue (weather permitting).

Please note: Minimal age is 12 years (accompanied by an adult). This tour is not suitable for guests with reduced mobility, back or neck issues and pregnant women.

Snorkeling is optional, Guests participating to the snorkeling must be experienced swimmers.

The itinerary and the tour sequence may be changed at Captain's discretion depending on weather conditions and tide. Guests are advised to wear your swimsuit under the clothes and to bring a hat, sunscreen, sunglasses, a towel and water. Snorkeling equipment is not provided, please bring your equipment from the ship.

The boats for this excursion come over from St Vincent and the crossing to Tobago Cays depends very much on conditions at sea. Consequently, the excursion may have to be cancelled in case of rough seas.



ST LUCIA (Marigot bay)

A lush island of tropical beauty, St. Lucia is part of the Windward Islands. Its 238-square miles are covered with rain forests, banana plantations, palm-lined beaches, mountains and even a drive-in volcano. Like many of its neighbours, St Lucia was a hotly disputed territory, with Britain and France battling for possession. Indeed, the island changed hands no less than 14 times, earning it the nickname of "the Helen of the Caribbean". The English eventually gained control until independence was granted in 1979. St. Lucia has also had its share of natural disasters, including several fires and hurricanes. Though tourism is now the island's economic backbone, sugar cane was the primary industry from the 1800's to 1960. Among St. Lucia's most noted attractions are the Pitons, two volcanic cones rising up from the sea that have become a symbol of the island itself. Today, St Lucia offers its guests a wide range of natural charm with beautiful beaches, lush scenery, fishing villages unchanged by time and friendly Caribbean hospitality.

ST LUCIA (Marigot bay) - Soufrière Tour and Caribbean Coast

Duration: 05:00 approx. Transportation: air-conditioned minibus

Price: 82 € Activity level: moderate

Min 20 / Max 80 participants

Lunch included (drinks not included)

This tour leaves from Marigot bay and ends in Soufrière bay

Departing from beautiful Marigot Bay, you will travel along the western coast, bypassing the fishing villages of Anse la Raye and Canaries, before the descent into the town of Soufriere. The sight of the majestic Pitons, two great peaks which have come to be a symbol of the island itself, will fill you with awe. Arrive at the Villa des Pitons (or similar) for a delicious Creole lunch. Nestled on the hillside this enchanting resort affords a spectacular view of St. Lucia's rain forest.

Your journey will continue to an award-winning historical site, the Soufriere Estate's Diamond Botanical Gardens, Waterfall & Mineral Baths. Established in 1745, it is one of the oldest estates on the island and was a portion of the 2000 acres of land that was granted to the owners by King Louis XIV in 1713 in recognition of their services to the Crown & Country. A guided tour takes you through the beautiful Botanical Gardens and the falls which cascade down through mineral-streaked rock walls and jungle thick ferns. The water forms a stream that flows through underground pipes to a series of baths at different temperatures. These mineral baths were originally built in 1784 by the Baron De Laborie and were restored in 1925 by the owners of the estate. These hot mineral springs are enjoyed today for therapeutic bathing. The gardens themselves are quite beautiful and after your guided tour there will be an opportunity to purchase a postcard or small souvenir before departing. Driving up through lushly verdant rainforest you will enter the world's only drive-in volcano, La Soufriere. The roads lead you right up to the remnants of a volcanic crater; a moonscape of barren earth and gravel where pools of muddy water bubble and belch out clouds of steam and a smell of sulphur pervades the atmosphere.

After your informative tour you can enjoy a warm refreshing dip in the sulphureous pool below the bridge.

Please note: Passengers should note that the road to Soufriere is very winding so people who suffer from motion sickness should take necessary precautions before the tour.

A buffet lunch will be provided. Beverages are not included during lunch, but you will be offered a welcome drink.

Guests are advised to wear a swimsuit under weather-appropriate clothes and comfortable walking shoes and to bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent, water and US \$ or credit cards if they want to purchase gifts of additional beverages.

Please note that the sulphureous water in the swimming pool can cause a chemical reaction; if you wish to bathe, please do not wear any jewelry or light-colored swimsuits which could be damaged.

Swimming goggles come in handy, as the water may irritate the eyes, and plastic sandals are also useful.

ST LUCIA (Marigot bay) - 4x4 adventure in St Lucia

Duration: 03:00 approx. Transportation: 4X4 open back vehicles

Price: 55 € Activity level: moderate

Min 10 / Max 36 participants

A combination of fun, history, sightseeing and a change to see the island from a totally different perspective!

Take off in your jeep and embark on your journey where you will see in the valley banana plants swaying in the breeze and you enjoy a bit of off-road experience whilst driving through many communities and the view of our tallest mountain on island – Mt. Gimie. Stop along the route for a chance to sample refreshing coconut water and other seasonal fruits. Your forest



adventure begins as you arrive at the start of your short hike which takes you along a river to a typical local waterfall of water cascading over the rocks, set in the lush greenery of the surrounding vegetation. Enjoy a cool dip in the river before heading back to the jeep for a drive to the nearby quaint and rustic fishing village of Anse la Raye. Interact with the villagers and stroll around the waterfront and maybe a chance to see the fishermen pulling in their catch for the day. Visit the historical Roman Catholic village church, one of the oldest churches on the island. On your return journey, drive along a coastal road enjoying the scenery with elevated sea views, just perfect for photos. A final stop at the Marigot Bay viewpoint is made and an opportunity to purchase some of the most delicious local sauces on island. Even our local beer — Piton and rum punch. Drive to your ship, with wonderful memories of a fun-filled day!

Please note: This tour is operated with vehicles are 4X4 open back vehicles, that can accommodate 10 or 14 passengers. Participants should remain seated when driving along the roads.

This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility, pregnant women or anyone suffering from conditions (back, neck or other) which may be affected by bumpy roads.

Guests are advised to wear weather-appropriate clothes and comfortable walking shoes and to bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent and water. For the stop at the waterfall, guests are advised to wear a swimsuit under their clothes and to bring a towel from the ship and water shoes.

The water at the waterfall is not crystal clear at all times especially when it rains, and the river carries topsoil and silt which makes the water seem unclean. However, it is safe to swim or take a quick dip.

The walk to the waterfall is 15 minutes approx. each way. Due care must always be taken on the trail over uneven, rough ground and natural rocks and if it has rained the ground can be slippery and persons should take care.

Be prepared to get your feet/shoes wet when going through the stream.

SAINT LUCIA (Soufrière bay)

SAINT LUCIA (Soufrière bay) - Natural attractions of La Soufrière

Duration: 03:00 approx. Transportation: air-conditioned minibus

Price: 52 € Activity level: moderate

Min 10 / Max 80 participants

This tour begins with a leisurely drive through the town of Soufrière, bypassing the town square and the Cathedral. Your journey will continue to the Sulphur Springs, known as the Caribbean's, only drive-in volcano. This historic site is the result of volcanic eruptions over 300,000 years ago. The sulfurous atmosphere is immediately apparent and sulfur water has been proved to have many medicinal properties, so don't be afraid to breathe deeply and inhale the sulfur laden air. The Botanical Gardens and Diamond Baths are very famous, and it is said that Josephine de Beauharnais, later the Empress Josephine, wife of Napoleon, bathed in the waters. Admire the tropical plants along the pathway and the magnificent waterfall before getting back on the bus.

After a short drive you will arrive at the Villa des Pitons Restaurant for complimentary drinks and enjoy local rum or fruit punch while relaxing on the verandah. Be sure to have your cameras at the ready, the view of the two majestic twin peaks soaring out of the sea at Soufrière Bay makes for a splendid photo opportunity. The tour ends with a short drive down to the jetty where your ship awaits.

SAINT LUCIA - Morne Coubaril Estate and Hotwire Pitons zip line ride

The fun filled activity combines the adrenaline rush of zipping under the sheer Petit Piton, with breathtaking views of the historic town of Soufrière and the Caribbean Sea.

Depart ship and take a short drive through the rustic town of Soufrière up to the Hotwire Zipline Adventure Park at Morne Coubaril Estate in Soufrière. On arrival you are taken for a guided tour of this working plantation through a small village of huts



made from sticks. The surrounding gardens are well stocked with the plants and flowers indigenous to the island.

Your guide will then lead you up the estate driveway to manioc house where you will learn how cassava bread is made., you will learn about the process of de-husking a coconut and oven drying copra, before sampling some coconut water and jelly. After enjoying the bay view from the point, you will also get the opportunity to taste a ripe cocoa bean at the cocoa and coffee house before seeing the process of fermentation and bean drying, and the cocoa dance used to polish the dried beans.

The highlight of the tour is our mule driven sugar cane mill and the chance to enjoy some delicious fresh cane juice.

After the tour, you will be equipped with harness, helmet and gloves and be given a safety briefing and training demonstration before setting off on your zip line adventure. The first platform offers a panoramic view of the bay and the awe-inspiring Pitons. While you whizz safely between giant Banyans, your experienced guides will provide a running commentary on the eco-system and the spectacular views provided by this zip line trail, built to US standards.

Eight zip cables move you effortlessly through the estate and you can take your own aerial photos of the Piton and town below, before being carried into a canopy of banyan, coconut, plum and mango trees and across a bamboo-shadowed gorge. The zip lines offer a total immersion in the natural environment.

After your Zip line Adventure, you will be escorted to a typical local restaurant to enjoy some refreshment including juice made from fruit produced on the estate. The restaurant is surrounded by gingerbread cottages which house our gift shop.

Please note: This excursion combines the adrenaline rush of zipping as well as a short sightseeing tour.

A friendly and knowledgeable Nature guide will be waiting to greet you and your nature experience begins the moment you step off the bus. You will enjoy a guided tour through curated nature trails where you will learn all about the local flora and fauna. You will do some bird watching, learn about the medicinal uses of the plants found on the trail and stop to enjoy some breathtaking



scenery. You will see the island's most photographed landmark, the Pitons, and the island's tallest mountain Mount Gimmie. The tour continues to the farm where you will get to sample some freshly picked fruit. You will hear about the planting methods used and enjoy fresh fruit juice made from fruit grown on the estate.
