What you need to know before booking your shore excursion:

- All our excursions are led by local English-speaking guides or driver-guides.
- The length of the tours and time spent on the sites is given as an indication as it may vary depending on weather, sea and traffic conditions and on the group's pace.
- The level of physical fitness required for our activities is given as a very general indication.
- Transportation: roads in the islands can be winding and bumpy. Vehicles used (coasters, minibuses, minivans) have generally small seats and limited space and legroom.
- Guests will be required to sign a liability waiver to participate in some activities.

How you can book your shore excursions:

- Shore excursions can be booked onboard, using the "sign-up lists" available at the Library.
- The price of the excursion will be added to your on-board account.
- A minimum number of participants is required for each tour; if the required number is not attained, the tour may be cancelled.
- To provide the best service and to avoid disappointments, please book your shore excursions as early as possible: places are limited and there is a booking deadline for each port.
- Cancellation and changes are possible until the booking deadline. After the booking deadline, 100% cancellation fees will be charged. Booking deadlines will be indicated on the Daily Program and on the booking forms.
- Transfers and tours ending at the airport can also be prepaid prior to your cruise.
- Excursions in Quépos "Manuel Antonio National Park nature walk" and "Villa Vanilla spice tour" must be booked in advance with Star Clippers.

Important notes:

- Departure times of the excursions are mentioned in the Daily Program of each port, which you will receive in your cabin the evening before each stopover.
- All information concerning excursions is correct at the time of printing. However, Star Clippers reserves the right to make changes. The latest updated tour descriptions are available onboard the ship in a file at the Library and on Star Clippers' website (you can download the file using the QR code).

QUEPOS – Villa Vanilla spice tour

Sightseeing

This excursion must be pre-booked and is not available for purchase onboard.

Embark on an immersive journey through our interactive spice farm tour, a delightful adventure designed to captivate the curiosity and the senses of guests of all ages. Villa Vanilla is a 160-acre (65 hectare) sustainable farm located about 30 minutes drive from Quépos. The farm was founded in 1987. and it is now planted with a variety of popular herbs and spices, minor plantings of common and exotic fruits, trees, flowering and medicinal plants. The flora diversity has brought back the fauna diversity that is normally present in tropical humid forests.

Engage all your senses and explore our farm, discovering an array of spices that include beloved vanilla, Ceylon cinnamon, rich cacao, zesty black pepper, allspice, vibrant turmeric and some exotic fruits and healing plants.

At the end of the visit, you will enjoy a diverse tasting menu featuring both sweet and savory dishes that highlight spices that you have encountered along your walk through the spice farm. You will have the chance to buy some spices and gifts at the spice shop. Learning about how these spices grow in harmony with the rainforest is a fun and tasty experience that you won't forget!

Please note:

- The tour involves moderate walking on mostly flat surfaces with some rustic steps.
- Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent and water.
- The journey between Quepos and Villa Vanilla takes approximately 30 minutes by minibus.

QUEPOS – Mangrove wildlife and boat cruise



Sightseeing | Wildlife

This tour runs with the tides and might not be available for some of the calls.

A ride through the Mangrove is like entering another world. The trees that grow in the brackish water form a unique and very fragile ecosystem. Most of the trees grow along the estuary, developing an aerial root system. At low tide the exposed tree roots make a perfect habitat for crabs. In the upper part of the forest, you can expect to see monkeys and a great variety of birdlife including herons, egrets, and spoonbills, amongst others.

A minibus and a naturalist guide will be waiting on the pier to take you on a 30-minute drive to the departure point. Here a naturalist tour guide will tell you all about the mangrove, which, although you may not know it, plays a vital role in the sustainability of the planet.

A shaded boat will take you deep into the heart of the mangrove and you can try and spot all the different species of wildlife that live there. After a boat ride of 1h45 you will arrive at the village and enjoy a well-deserved snack before taking the minibus back to the pier. You can also be dropped off at Quepos, where you will find several restaurants and shops.

Please note:

- Dress for the weather and bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent and water.
- Tour sequence may vary (this tour runs with the tides).
- The journey between Quepos and the boat departure point takes approximately 30 minutes by minibus.

Sightseeing | Wildlife

This excursion must be pre-booked and is not available for purchase onboard. National Park tickets are non-refundable.

This excursion is one of the best in the Central Pacific region of Costa Rica and a great opportunity to experience the rainforest up close. Manuel Antonio National Park is a jewel among Costa Rica's national parks, whose fragile ecosystem is home to a variety of wildlife including mammals, reptiles and tropical birds. The park protects 683 hectares of tropical rainforest and over a thousand different species of flora. Another major attraction is the white sand beaches on the edge of the forest.

A short drive will take you to the National Park where you will enjoy a guided walk through the park (approximately 1.5 hours). Your guide will take you on a trek through the dense rainforest, telling you all about this unique environment rich in biodiversity and helping you spot wildlife with the help of a spotting scope.

The guided tour ends at Espadilla beach, where you will have the opportunity to take some great pictures, before walking back along the humid area to the entrance of the park.

Before returning to Quépos, enjoy tropical fruit snacks prepared by your guide.

Please note:

- This tour involves moderate walking (approx. 1.5 hours) over paths made out of gravel, dirt, and sand, with some uphill climbings. Heat and humidity are factors to consider.
- Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat, sunscreen, water and insect repellent.
- Wear a bathing suit under your clothes and bring a towel if you want to do a quick dip at the beach.
- Single-use plastic bottles are not permitted, visitors can bring reusable water bottles (plastic or metal).
- Our naturalist tour guides carry a professional spotting scope to facilitate and enhance your wildlife viewing experience. However, wildlife sightings cannot be guaranteed.
- Manuel Antonio Park is one of the most visited attractions in Costa Rica so you can expect large numbers of visitors and congestion inside the park and at the park's only entrance.
- Star Clippers is required to submit to the National Park full name and passport details of each visitor.
- The minibus journey between the port and the entrance of the national park takes approx. 20-30 minutes.

GOLFITO – Calathea botanical garden



Sightseeing

After a short bus ride through rural towns, you will arrive at Calathea Botanical Garden. A magical place where you will learn about the wonderful world of tropical plants!

The garden connects with Piedras Blancas National Park, home of over 300 species of birds. Here you will have the opportunity to discover a variety of flora, local biodiversity, bird watching, and more.

Upon your arrival, you will receive a warm welcome and an educational talk about the tropical garden!

Follow your tour guide through easy trails where he will explain everything about the different plants, flowers, trees, medicinal plants and natural history. Throughout the tour, visitors will be able to try some of the fruits growing there, among other plants. The garden is visited by a high density of colorful birds, so our visitors will be able to delight and enjoy the large number of species and take photographs or simply enjoy observing them. Among the most popular birds, the hummingbirds, toucans, woodpeckers, trogons, tanagers, parrots, among many more species, stand out. After this beautiful experience, return to the welcome center and enjoy some tropical fruits and snacks.

Please note:

- This excursion involves easy walking on flat surfaces.

Dress for the weather and bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent and water

- The journey between Golfito and Calatha garden takes approximately 30 minutes by minibus, on a dirty road.

Sightseeing | Wildlife

Costa Rica is home to one of the most biologically diverse marine ecosystems in the world, and its warm, nutrient-rich waters attract an abundance of wildlife—including dolphins. The best place to observe these fascinating creatures is off the Cosa Peninsula, described by National Geographic as "the most biologically intense place on Earth." You will board a boat and head into the calm waters of Golfo Dulce, where large pods of dolphins, sea turtles, and manta rays often appear, offering an unforgettable wildlife display. Other possible sightings include up to six species of sea turtles, schools of feeding tuna, and occasionally, marlin or sailfish. An experienced naturalist guide will accompany the tour, offering insights into the behavior, biology, and habitat of the marine life you may encounter. Weather permitting, you'll also enjoy a swim stop at a local beach, with excellent photo opportunities throughout the journey.

Please note:

- The itinerary and the tour sequence may be changed at Captain's discretion depending on weather conditions and tide. Marine wildlife sightings cannot be guaranteed.
- This excursion is not recommended for guests who suffer from sea sickness, those with mobility problems, neck/back problems, and pregnant women.
- Guests are advised to bring swimsuit, sunscreen and a towel from the ship. Wet landing is required at the beach stop.

GOLFITO - Kayak adventure on the mangrove estuary



Active & Adventure | Outdoors

After a safety talk you will paddle through the Golfito bay and border some of the mangrove estuary of the area. Birdwatchers will be enthusiastic about the sheer variety of sea birds including pelicans, frigate birds, egrets, herons, or ibis. Keep your eyes open and you may even see a pod of bottle-nosed dolphins; they sometimes stay in the area before heading out to the open waters of the gulf. Drag your kayak across the sand to kayak along the shoreline of a fishing village, before stopping to swim on a remote beach. Enjoy some time to relax at the beach and enjoy some fresh fruit and snacks before returning to Golfito.

Please note:

- This is a very active tour and is only recommended for guests in very good physical condition.
- Double kayaks will be used. The itinerary of the kayak tour will depend on the tide. Before the tour starts, practical instructions on how to maneuver the kayaks will be given.
- Minimal age is 12 years old (minors must be accompanied by an adult). Max weight is 235 lbs / 106 kg. Participants must be able to swim. Participants must read, fill out and sign a waiver prior to departure of this tour.
- Wear a swimsuit under your clothes and bring aqua shoes, sunscreen, sunglasses, hat, water shoes and t-shirt, a bottle of water and a towel from the ship and extra dry clothes. Waterproof protection for cameras or mobile is highly recommended.



COIBA NATIONAL PARK – Time at leisure (no shore excursions organized)

Nestled off the Pacific coast of Panama, Coiba National Park boasts a rich tapestry of biodiversity within its azure waters and dense rainforest. Recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, this pristine sanctuary encompasses the largest island in Central America, Coiba Island, along with 38 smaller islands. A haven for marine life, including sharks, dolphins, and humpback whales, the park's coral reefs teem with vibrant fish species. On land, it shelters rare flora and fauna. Its remote location has helped preserve its natural splendor, offering visitors a glimpse into a pristine ecosystem largely untouched by human development.

Due to National Park regulations there is only a certain amount of guests permitted to be at the same time on the islands. We will arrange several beach tours and snorkel tours to follow this requirement. Those can be booked free of charge aboard. Individual private shore leave is not possible.

PARIDA ISLAND (Marine Park Golfo de Chiriqui) – Time at leisure (no shore excursions organized)

The Gulf of Chiriquí is known for its lush tropical vegetation, pristine white sandy islands, and one of the largest coral reefs in the Pacific. Stretching along Panama's Pacific coast from the Costa Rica border to the Azuero Peninsula, it offers excellent opportunities for big game fishing, diving, and snorkeling. Isla Parida, an uninhabited island rich in wildlife, lies just off the coast and forms part of the protected Gulf of Chiriquí Marine Park.

ISLA TORTUGA - Curu Private Reserve



Sightseeing | Wildlife

A wet landing is required at Curu reserve!

Curu Reserve is one of the most remarkable natural areas on Costa Rica's Pacific coast and is considered the best place on this itinerary to experience wildlife in its natural habitat. Located in a region known for its calm seas and crystal-clear waters, the reserve preserves two-thirds of its 600 hectares as primary tropical forest, providing a vital refuge for a diverse range of species.

The reserve features 4.5 km of pristine coastline with white sandy beaches and secluded coves, offering a stunning setting for your visit. Your naturalist guide will lead you on a walk through this rich ecosystem, pointing out wildlife such as capuchin and howler monkeys, sloths, anteaters, and up to 200 species of birds that inhabit the area. Following the guided nature walk, you will take a tender ride (approx. 30 minutes) to Isla Tortuga's beach, where you can relax and soak in the natural beauty at your leisure or come back to the ship.

Please note:

- Wildlife sightings cannot be guaranteed but this reserve offers some of the best opportunities on this itinerary.
- This tour involves a 2 km walk on sandy, rocky and uneven surfaces. Heat and humidity are factors to consider. Dress for the weather (light clothing), wear walking shoes and bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent and water.
- The transfer to/from the Curu Reserve will be by ships' tender, with transfer to a zodiac and wet landing. A wet landing is required; guests will need to wade about 50 meters through knee-deep water to reach the shore.



PUERTO CALDERA – Costa Rican coffee experience at Doka Estate (ending at SJO airport)

Sightseeing | Airport transfer

This excursion ends at Juan Santamaría Intl. Airport (SJO) at approx. 15:15 and is suitable for guests with flight after 18:00

As your motorcoach departs from Puerto Caldera, immerse yourself in the lush greenery and breathtaking vistas of the Costa Rican countryside. Your journey takes you to the renowned Doka Estate, a coffee plantation nestled at an altitude of 4,500 feet (1,370 meters) above sea level.

Recognized as part of Costa Rica's Architectural Heritage for Humanity since 2003, Doka Estate is home to one of the country's oldest coffee mills. During your guided tour, you'll uncover the fascinating process behind Costa Rica's world-famous coffee - from harvesting and peeling the cherries to fermenting, drying, and storing the beans.

Witness traditional techniques that have been passed down through generations and are still used to produce high-quality coffee today.

As you explore the estate, you'll learn why it holds such cultural and historical significance - and of course, you'll enjoy a tasting of the estate's rich and aromatic brew.

After the tour, savor a delicious buffet lunch at La Cajuela, the estate's on-site restaurant, surrounded by lush gardens and spectacular mountain views. Following this unforgettable coffee experience, you will continue by coach to San José International Airport (SJO).

Please note:

- Guests will be transferred to the airport directly after lunch and will arrive at approximately 3:15 PM.
- Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat, insect repellent, a poncho and water.
- Luggage will be transported on the bus. Guests must retrieve their it upon arrival at the airport before check-in.
- Estimated drive times: 2 hours from the port to Doka Estate, 45 minutes from Doka Estate to SJO airport.

PUERTO CALDERA

Star Clippers also offers the following transfer services (optional, at an additional cost):

- Shared Transfer to Juan Santamaría Intl. Airport (SJO).

Guests who have purchased a shared transfer cannot choose their own pick up time.

There is a fixed departure from the port at approximately 09:00 (arrival at the airport at around 10:30) This transfer is suitable for guests whose flight departs after 13:00.

- Private transfers to Juan Santamaría Intl. Airport (SJO) or to hotels in San José

Pick up from the pier for private transfers is no later than 10:00.

- Private transfers from hotels in San José to the airport.

This service can only be pre-booked prior to your cruise and cannot be booked onboard.

Transfers and excursions ending at the airport can also be booked prior to your cruise.

Bookings made onboard during the cruise are always subject to avaialability.

If you wish to book a private transfer, we recommend that you book well in advance prior to your cruise, as the number of vehicles may be limited at certain times of the year.

For information and reservations please contact our reservations department or your travel agent.

Star Clipper will be alongside at the port of Puerto Caldera, the main commercial port in the Pacific side of Costa Rica. The port is located 85 km from San José and 70 km from SJO airport (approx. 90 min drive).

Taxis and transfers non arranged by Star Clippers are not allowed to enter the port but will be outside the main gate of the port. There will be a shuttle bus service to get to the exit of the commercial port.

The departure Star Clippers transfers and excursions will be from the pier (shuttle bus is not needed).

All guests are requested to leave the ship by 10:00am. There is no left-luggage service at the cruise terminal.



EXCURSIONS ACTIVITY LEVEL:

- ✓ **Easy**: excursion accessible to all participants, as it mainly takes place by bus or boat. Any footpaths and stairs that need to be negotiated are short or easy.
- ✓ **Moderate**: a certain basic level of fitness is required; excursion involving moderate walking sometimes over uneven or unpaved paths and stairs.
- ✓ **Moderate to strenuous**: active participation is required; excursion involving walking long distances over uneven or steep terrain. May involve several flights of stairs or extended staircases.
- ✓ **Strenuous**: a good level of fitness is required; an excursion involving extensive uphill walking on inclines, uneven terrain with many steps. Excursion involving off-road driving, not suitable for pregnant women or anyone with a medical condition (back, neck, etc.) that could be affected by bumpy roads.
- ✓ **Active (sport)**: Very good physical condition, stamina and skill are required. Passengers should be fit and active to participate in tours involving hiking, kayaking, snorkeling, cycling or similar activities.

The level of physical fitness required for our activities is given as a very general indication.

MAIN EXCURSIONS CATEGORIES:

- ✓ Sightseeing: it gives a quick but enriching overview, visiting and seeing the main attractions, landmarks and places of interest in a particular area, often including popular spots and sometimes hidden gems.
- ✓ Panoramic: it involves a limited number of long drives with commentary by the guide, no internal visits and generally limited walking between stops.
- ✓ Active & Adventure: Hiking, kayaking, Zip line, 4x4 off-road.
- ✓ Outdoors: Activities like hiking that let you explore the natural beauty of the region.
- ✓ Wildlife: Wildlife: Get up close to the region's fauna and learn about them in their natural habitats.

 We advise taking with binoculars to observe wildlife. Wildlife sightings cannot be guaranteed.
- ✓ Snorkeling. Guests participating in the snorkeling must be experienced swimmers. Itinerary and snorkel sites are subject to change due to sea and weather conditions. Check in the tour description to see if the snorkeling equipment is provided or if you must bring the equipment from the ship.
- ✓ Boating: Experience the destination from the water, whether it's sailing, cruising, or other maritime activities.

WHAT TO WEAR AND BRING WHEN GOING ASHORE ON EXCURSION:

- ✓ Unless special clothing suggestions are included in the excursion description, we recommend functional clothing and comfortable footwear.
- ✓ Comfortable shoes to help with any steep paths and uneven cobbles.
- ✓ A hat or cap, sun lotion, insect repellent.
- ✓ Water.
- ✓ For boat excursions or excursions including beach stop: swimsuit, beach towel, sunglasses, sunscreen, water shoes, snorkel mask.
- ✓ Mobile phone or camera to capture the moment.
- ✓ Ship card to get back on board.
- ✓ Some cash (US \$ is widely accepted, bring Euros for French islands).
- ✓ A copy of the Daily Program, to check last tender or last gangway time, tender schedule, lunch time, etc.
- ✓ For ports with tender service (ship at anchor), bring a rucksack or fanny pack so that your hands are free to hold on to the safety grip when boarding the tender.
