What you need to know before booking your shore excursion:

- All our excursions are led by English-speaking guides. A second language may be used, depending on the number of non-English-speaking passengers and guides' availability.
- The length of the tours and time spent on the sites is given as an indication as it may vary depending on weather, sea and traffic conditions and on the group's pace.
- The level of physical fitness required for our activities is given as a very general indication.

How you can book your shore excursions:

- Shore excursions can be booked on board, using the booking forms (sign-up lists) available at the Excursion Desk.
- The price of the excursion will be added to your on-board account.
- Transfers and debark tours ending at the airport can also be pre-paid prior to your cruise.
- In order to provide the best service and to avoid disappointments, please book your shore excursions as early as possible: places are limited and there is a booking deadline for each port.
- Booking deadlines will be indicated on the Daily Program and on the booking forms.
- Cancellation and changes are possible until the booking deadline. After the booking deadline, 100% cancellation fees will be charged.
- A minimum number of participants is required for each tour; if the required number is not attained, the tour may be cancelled.

Important notes:

- Departure times of the tour are mentioned in the Daily Program of each port.
- All information concerning excursions is correct at the time of printing. **However, Star Clippers reserves the right to make changes.** The latest updated tour descriptions are available on board the ship in a file at the Excursion Desk and on Star Clippers' website (you can download the file using the QR code).

ELBA (Portoferraio) – Panoramic Elba and view from Monte Capanne

The scenic drive from Portoferraio takes you to the island's western highlands. The journey passes through the centre of the island before continuing along the coast to the upmarket resort of Marciana Marina. The coach then heads into the hills to reach the cable car station at Marciana Alta. During the journey your guide will tell you about the island's history, culture and natural environment while you sit back and enjoy the beautiful views of the surrounding hilltop villages and coastline.

On arrival your guide will give you a safety briefing and explain how to get on and off the cable car baskets safely. The baskets, which depart every 20 seconds for the 20-minute climb to the top of Mount Capanne (1,019m), each hold two passengers. The views during the cable car ride are quite spectacular, so make sure you have your camera handy. From the panoramic terrace at the top station you can enjoy breathtaking views of all the islands in the Tuscan archipelago. After some free time (about 30 minutes), your guide will take you back to the coach and the tour will continue to Marciana Marina. Here you will have time to stroll along the seafront and explore the picturesque village. Before returning to the port, look out for Elba's specialities: wonderful perfumes, truly the scent of the Mediterranean captured in a bottle, and delicious local wines.

Please note:

- ✓ This tour is not suitable for passengers with walking difficulties, heart problems or vertigo. You will take an open-air cable car (cabins are baskets without any cover and can accommodate 2 people) to the top of Mount Capanne. A certain agility is required to board the cable car basket.
- ✓ Shops in Marciana Marina might be closed on Sundays and public holidays.
- ✓ Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat and water.
- ✓ Estimated driving times: between Portoferraio and the cable car 50 min; between the cable car and Marciana Marina 20 min; between Marciana Marina and Portoferraio 40 min.

ELBA (Portoferraio) - Porto Azzurro and winery

From Portoferraio, cross the island from north to south until you reach the Gulf of Lacona, then Golfo Stella and Porto Azzurro. There will be plenty of opportunities to enjoy the scenery and take fantastic photographs.

At Porto Azzurro you will have time to wander the charming streets of this town dominated by an ancient medieval fortress. The town also has a pretty fishing harbour and many shops selling minerals and crystals.

Then rejoin the coaches for a panoramic tour of the island. Next stop is "La Chiusa", an old country estate set in a vineyard overlooking the sea.

The estate dates back to the 1700's and includes a country house, a wine cellar and a miniature chapel. The owner's house, with its double outside staircase, was built later in the 1800s. "La Chiusa hosted Napoleon Bonaparte on two occasions: once on 3 May 1814 on his arrival in Elba, while waiting to be officially received in Portoferraio, and once during a hunting party on Mount Fabbrello. Here you will have the opportunity to taste some local specialities and a selection of three different wines. The tour continues with a scenic bus ride from Porto Azzurro to Portoferraio, with beautiful views of the Gulf of Portoferraio and its harbour.

Please note:

- ✓ Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat and water.
- ✓ Estimated driving times: Portoferraio to Porto Azzurro: 30min ; Porto Azzurro to La Chiusa: 30 min ; La Chiusa to Portoferraio: 25 min. The order of the visits is subject to change.



BASTIA - Corsican Traditions & Stories (walking tour)

Bastia is the capital of northern Corsica and the largest commercial port on the island. Bastia was founded in 1380 by the Genoese, who were looking for a naturally sheltered port that would ensure contact between Genoa and Corsica. Even though this small port was exposed to terrible winds, it was protected by a rock, easily defensible, on which a dungeon (or bastiglia) was built - hence the name of the city of Bastia.

Follow our local guide through the narrow streets and discover some of the signs of a rich and interesting past.

Your tour begins with a stop at Place St Nicolas, a lively square lined with cafes and historic buildings. From here, explore the old Vieux Bastia, wandering through its charming narrow streets before reaching the Citadel, an iconic symbol of the city's Genoese past. The numerous religious buildings scattered throughout the island testify to the deep religious fervour of its inhabitants and their attachment to the Catholic faith. Despite this, the collective consciousness remains steeped in many pagan traditions, with relics of ancient beliefs.

Each region of the island has preserved its customs and traditions like so many treasures, and Corsica is teeming with visionaries, healers and mediums. Over the centuries, oral tradition has perpetuated the myth of the strange and the wonderful. The memory of the Corsicans, steeped in history and culture, has been handed down from generation to generation until the not too distant past. Today, when this diluted past comes back to us in the form of childhood memories, we try to recover its essence, sometimes with infinite nostalgia.

Please note:

- ✓ This tour is entirely on foot and is not recommended to guests with limited mobility since it involves extensive walking (approx. 3 km) over cobblestone surfaces with some steps and uneven surfaces to negotiate.
- ✓ Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat and water.
- ✓ You will have about 30 minutes of free time to shop on your own during the tour.

BASTIA - Bastia and Corsican savours (walking tour)

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Stop at a Corsican grocery and discover the richness and variety of Corsican gastronomy and the art of local charcuterie. Each product is an exploration of the complex and subtle flavours that only Corsica can offer.

You'll taste a variety of cold cuts, cheeses and "canistrelli", deliciously fragrant and crispy biscuits.

Next, enjoy a Corsican snack at a local eatery to sample the island's traditional flavours. The tour concludes with a visit to the renowned Mattei Concept Store, where you'll indulge in a tasting of Corsican spirits and discover the unique flavours of the island's most famous aperitifs and liqueurs. Taste the traditional Corsican aperitif 'Cap Corse Mattei' in its two versions, red and white. The traditional recipe uses muscatel and vermentinu grape juice, mixed with macerations of cinchona peel, Corsican lemon and a selection of fruits, plants and spices.

Your tour begins with a ride on the little train that takes you up to the Upper Town, the heart of the Bonifacio Citadel. Your guide will then take you for a walk around the old citadel and the Genoese town. You will see the marine cemetery on the cliffs, which offers a spectacular view over the Strait of Bonifacio. The island of Sardinia is only 12 km away. The tour continues in the old town, where you will stroll through the maze of narrow, winding streets, passing fascinating historical sites such as the 16th century Bastion de L'Etendard and the 12th century Eglise Sainte-Marie Majeure. After some time at leisure, return to the marina and walk back to the ship.

Please note:

- ✓ This tour involves extensive walking over cobblestone and uneven surfaces and some steps. At the end of the tour there is an 800-meter walk on a flat surface along the Marina from the drop-off point of the little train to the pier.
- ✓ Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat and water.
- ✓ You will have about 30 minutes of free time to shop on your own during the tour.

BONIFACIO - Coastal boat trip

A specially chartered boat will meet you at the pier. After boarding the boat, you will set off to explore the coast, leaving the harbour through a narrow channel between the towering cliffs of Bonifacio. The boat will pass the "Madonetta" lighthouse, built in 1854, and from the outside you can see the "Sdragnato" or "Little Dragon" sea cave. The itinerary continues to the "Fazio Creek" and then, following the cliff in a south-easterly direction, you will pass the rock known as the "Rudder of Corsica" and the steps of the King of Aragon. According to legend, these steps were carved out by the Aragonese during a single night in 1420 to facilitate a surprise attack on the inhabitants during the siege of Bonifacio. However, they predate this event and had a much more mundane function, allowing the locals to carry water up to the citadel.

The final highlight of the tour is the "Grain of Sand" rock, a large, isolated rock formed by erosion, which stands about 10 metres out in the sea. This picturesque site will make you reach for your camera as it provides the perfect backdrop for a photographic souvenir.

- ✓ The boat is chartered exclusively for Star Clippers' guests. Tour timing and itinerary are subject to sea conditions.

Your guide will meet you at the port and accompany you on the walk to the coach park where your coach will be waiting. You will travel through the landscape of the Nurra region, a striking mixture of fertile plains and mountains. There will be a short stop at a panoramic viewpoint on the road to Capo Caccia, with stunning views over the bay and the island of Foradada.

Continue on to the Leda D'Ittiri winery, where you will be welcomed by Anna Maria, who will give you a brief history of the estate before inviting you to taste the wines accompanied by cheese, bread, bruschetta and olive oil.

The Leda' d'Ittiri estate is located at the foot of Monte Doglia, a few kilometres from the bustling city of Alghero and its beautiful white sandy beaches. The estate consists of 18 hectares of olive groves and vineyards, which are lovingly tended by the owners: Antonella and Anna Maria, the mother and daughter team at the head of this ambitious project. They are descendants of the Sardinian nobility and theirs is the only heraldic coat of arms that adorns the Sardinian wine industry. The estate's prime location has allowed the owners to combine purely agricultural activities with the promotion of the area and its products to tourists. After the wine tasting, you will return to Alghero and you can return to the ship to explore the old town independently.

Please note:

- ✓ The photo stop on Capo Caccia will be made in a panoramic point overlooking Foradada island; it is not possible to reach the end of the promontory with a motorcoach. The order of the visits is subject to change.
- ✓ Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat and water.
- ✓ Estimated driving times: from Alghero to Capo Caccia 45 min; from Capo Caccia to the winery 30 min; from the winery to Alghero 30 min.

ALGHERO - Medieval Alghero and wine tasting (walking tour)

Alghero is the gateway to Sardinia and is also known as the "little Barcelona" of Sardinia: the city has indeed preserved the use of Catalan, of which it is a linguistic island, rediscovering the Spanish features in the architectural and urban details and in the Catalan language of its inhabitants.

The route starts at Porta a Mare, one of the ancient entrances to the city, and continues along the famous bastions and towers. Walking through the historical centre, you will reach the Convent of San Francesco (outside visit), one of the most fascinating and important monuments of late Gothic and Renaissance architecture in Sardinia, and then continue towards the old entrance to the city: Torre di Porta Terra; this gate was used to enter and leave the city by land until the end of the 19th century and was originally protected by a heavy drawbridge, now removed, which was lowered at dawn and raised at sunset.

The tour continues towards Piazza Civica, the heart of the city, with its important buildings.

Afterwards, you'll walk along the Alghero seafront to reach a charming wine bar where you can taste the excellent Alghero wines accompanied by local specialities (cold meats and cheeses), before returning to the pier.

At the end of the visit, you can return to the boat or explore the old town on your own.

Please note:

- ✓ This tour involves moderate walking (approx 2,5 km) on cobblestone and uneven surfaces (mostly flat) with some inclines.
- ✓ Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat and water.
- ✓ The order of the visits is subject to change.



CALVI - Villages of Balagne (Sant'Antonino & Pigna)

This excursion is the perfect way to enjoy one of Corsica's main attractions: its ruggedly beautiful landscape; winding roads take you from one picturesque village to another.

The ancient circular village of Sant'Antonino, perched on a rugged rock overlooking the sea, is one of the oldest inhabited villages in Corsica and one of the highest. Visible from afar, it offers a magnificent 360° panoramic view. In the 9th century it was ruled by the Counts of Savelli, who built the now ruined castle to defend their clan. The narrow cobbled streets, arched alleys and neat stone houses have survived the passage of time and have changed little over the last three hundred years. Sant'Antonino is listed as one of the "most beautiful villages in France" and is much loved by visitors for its spectacular views.

After a short visit to Sant'Antonino, you will be taken to the hilltop village of Pigna.

This charming village in the heart of the Balagne region is built on a rocky promontory 224m above sea level, at the foot of a mountain some 562m high. It is a feast for the eyes with its flowered streets and attractive village square. Pigna is dedicated to the pursuit of arts and crafts and a community of artists has settled here. It is the ideal place to buy some authentic Corsican souvenirs, made on the spot and sometimes in front of your eyes.

You will spend some time in the village and then the coach will take you back to Calvi via the charming old villages of Corbara and Aregno.

Please note:

- ✓ This tour involves walking over cobblestone and uneven surfaces, with many steps to negotiate.
- ✓ This tour involves a lot of driving. Corsican roads are panoramic but winding, so this is not the ideal tour for guests suffering from motion sickness.
- ✓ You will spend approximately 40 minutes in each village (Sant'Antonino and Pigna). Itinerary might be reversed.
- ✓ Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat and water.

You will pass Notre Dame de la Serra, a small church overlooking Calvi and its bay, the villages of Sant Antonino and Corbara.

There are stops along the way for photos and refreshments. At the end of your off-road tour you will return to the pier. Depending on the weather conditions, the route may vary.

- ✓ This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility, pregnant women or anyone suffering from conditions (back, neck or other) which may be affected by bumpy roads.

Discover the breathtaking landscapes and charming villages of Corsica's Balagne region on this exciting tour where history, culture and natural beauty come together. Board your coach at the pier and begin your journey inland, taking in the breathtaking scenery as you wind your way through picturesque villages. Your first stop is Calenzana, a historic village known for its impressive church and beautiful surroundings. Enjoy a short stop to soak up the local atmosphere and board your coach again to continue onto your next experience.

Visit a traditional olive oil mill where you'll witness the fascinating process of olive oil production, powered by a donkey-driven mill. Enjoy a tasting of locally produced olive oil, a true Corsican speciality.

Continuing your scenic drive, you'll pass through Cateri, a quaint village with charming flowered balconies, before arriving at the hilltop gem of Sant'Antonino. Before exploring, enjoy a refreshing stop at Clos Antonini, famous for its delicious citrus juice 'limonata'. Then enjoy 30 minutes free time to stroll around the medieval village, take in the breathtaking views or simply soak up the authentic Corsican charm.

Your return journey to Calvi will take you through the villages of Lavatoggio and Lumio, giving you one last chance to admire the rugged beauty of the Balagne countryside.

Please note:

- ✓ This tour involves walking over cobblestone and uneven surfaces, with many steps to negotiate. In Sant’Antoninu, the coach will park near the church below the village. Guests wishing to explore the village must walk uphill from the parking area.
- ✓ This tour involves a lot of driving. Corsican roads are panoramic but winding, so this is not the ideal tour for guests suffering from motion sickness.
- ✓ Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat and water.

MONACO - Eze and Monaco

The coach leaves Monaco and heads for Eze via the Moyenne Corniche coastal road, which offers stunning views of the Riviera. Eze is a perfect example of a hilltop village, perched like an eagle's nest on a rocky outcrop 1401 feet above the sea. The tour of Eze is on foot and you enter through a 14th century double gate with crenellations. A watchtower leads into narrow streets with carefully restored houses, now used as artists' studios and boutiques. The Exotic Garden of Eze is located on the site of a medieval castle that dominates the village and offers one of the most spectacular views of the French Riviera.

After the visit, drive to Monaco to see the old town, built on a rocky outcrop that offers a panoramic view of the new town and its skyscrapers. This tiny principality has been ruled almost continuously by the Grimaldi family since 1297.

Do you believe in fairy tales? Whether you do or not, this enchanting city is not to be missed. Escalators and lifts take you up to the top of the old town. Once on the hill, a guided walk through the narrow streets will take you past the Oceanographic Museum, the Cathedral which contains the tomb of Princess Grace and Prince Rainier III, and the exterior of the Prince's Palace (no interior visit included). Enjoy some free time before rejoining the ship.

Please note:

- ✓ The tour requires a considerable amount of uphill walking on cobblestone streets, steps and inclines and standing while visiting Eze. In Monaco, there is a moderate walk over a relatively flat but uneven surface.
- ✓ Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat and water. Appropriate attire is required to visit the Cathedral (no bare shoulders or shorts are allowed). Monaco Cathedral could be closed without notice due to religious ceremonies.
- ✓ Driving time between Monaco and Eze is approximately 30 minutes.

Most tours of Monte-Carlo and Monaco Rock involve a considerable amount of walking as coaches are not allowed to drive in the city. However, our tour uses city buses so you are taken directly to the main attractions.

Old Monaco: The narrow streets of Old Monaco and the Prince's Palace cling together on a rocky outcrop. You will see the Prince's Palace Square and the Cathedral where Prince Rainier married Grace Kelly. There will be some free time for shopping.

Monte-Carlo: The Place du Casino is the prestigious "Golden Square", home to the Hotel de Paris, the Café de Paris and the legendary Monte-Carlo Casino. Admire the exterior of this imposing and magnificent casino, built in 1863 by Charles Garnier, the architect of the Paris Opera. The casino stands on a beautiful terrace surrounded by gardens.

Please note:

- ✓ This tour involves moderate walking on a relatively flat but uneven surface, with some inclines and steps.
- ✓ City buses are chartered for Star Clippers and are designed also for standing occupancy. The majority of passengers (approximately 20) will be seated; however, a few people may be required to stand during these short transfers.
- ✓ At the Cathedral, tour guide will give explanations from outside before guests enter. Cathedral could be closed without notice due to religious ceremonies.
- ✓ Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat and water. Appropriate attire is required to visit the Cathedral (no bare shoulders or shorts are allowed).
- ✓ The visit of the Casino is not included and can be done during the free time. Guests are advised that they will need a valid ID with photo or passport to enter the Casino (driving licenses are not accepted). Appropriate attire is required to enter the Casino.

NICE

The ship will be alongside at one of the cruise pier of the port of Nice, located next to the city center and 10 km from Nice airport. All guests are requested to leave the ship before 10:00am.

Star Clippers offers the following transfer services (optional, on request):

- Shared Transfer to Nice airport (NCE).

- ✓ Guests who have purchased a shared transfer cannot choose their own pick up time.
- ✓ There is a fixed departure from the port at 08:45 (arrival at the airport approx. 09:15).
- ✓ This transfer is suitable for guests whose flight departs after 11:15.

- Private transfers to Nice airport or to hotels in Nice.

- ✓ Pick up from the pier for private transfers is no later than 10:00.
- ✓ Private transfers are operated by private cars (1-2 passengers) or private vans (3-4 passengers).

- Private transfers from hotels to the airport

- ✓ Private transfers are operated by private cars (1-2 passengers) or private vans (3-4 passengers).
- ✓ This service can only be pre-booked.

Transfers can also be booked prior to your cruise.

Bookings made on board during the cruise are always subject to availability.

If you wish to book a private transfer, we recommend that you pre-book it well in advance prior to your cruise, as the number of vehicles may be limited at certain times of the year.

EXCURSIONS ACTIVITY LEVEL:

- ✓ **Easy:** excursion accessible to all participants, as it mainly takes place by bus or boat. Any footpaths and stairs that need to be negotiated are short or easy.
- ✓ **Moderate:** a certain basic level of fitness is required; excursion involving moderate walking - sometimes over uneven or unpaved paths and stairs.
- ✓ **Moderate to strenuous:** active participation is required; excursion involving walking long distances over uneven or steep terrain. May involve several flights of stairs or extended staircases.
- ✓ **Strenuous:** a good level of fitness is required; an excursion involving extensive uphill walking on inclines, uneven terrain with many steps. Excursion involving off-road driving, not suitable for pregnant women or anyone with a medical condition (back, neck, etc.) that could be affected by bumpy roads.
- ✓ **Active (sport):** Very good physical condition, stamina and skill are required. Passengers should be fit and active to participate in tours involving hiking, kayaking, snorkeling, cycling or similar activities.

The level of physical fitness required for our activities is given as a very general indication.

MAIN EXCURSIONS CATEGORIES:

- ✓ **Culture & History:** it explores places of historical significance and visits ancient ruins or historic buildings, gives a deeper understanding of the region's heritage.
- ✓ **Sightseeing:** it gives a quick but enriching overview, visiting and seeing the main attractions, landmarks and places of interest in a particular area, often including popular spots and sometimes hidden gems.
- ✓ **Food & Wine:** it explores the culinary traditions of a region, from visiting local markets and vineyards to cooking classes or wine tastings.
- ✓ **Panoramic:** it involves a limited number of long drives with commentary by the guide, no internal visits and - generally - limited walking between stops.
- ✓ **Active & Adventure:** Hiking, kayaking, cycling, ATV, 4x4 off-road.

WHAT TO WEAR AND BRING WHEN GOING ASHORE ON EXCURSION:

- ✓ Unless special clothing suggestions are included in the excursion description, we recommend functional clothing and comfortable footwear.
- ✓ Comfortable shoes to help with any steep paths and uneven cobbles.
- ✓ A hat or cap and sun lotion.
- ✓ Water.
- ✓ For boat excursions or excursions including beach stop: swimsuit, beach towel, sunglasses, sunscreen, water shoes, snorkel mask.
- ✓ Mobile phone or camera to capture the moment.
- ✓ Ship card to get back on board.
- ✓ Some cash in local currency.
- ✓ A copy of the Daily Program, to check last tender or last gangway time, tender schedule, lunch time, etc.
- ✓ For ports with tender service (ship at anchor), bring a rucksack or fanny pack so that your hands are free to hold on to the safety grip when boarding the tender.
