What you need to know before booking your shore excursion:

- All our excursions are led by English-speaking guides. A second language may be used, depending on the number of non-English-speaking passengers and the availability of guides.
- The length of the tours and time spent on the sites is given as an indication as it may vary depending on weather, sea and traffic conditions and on the group's pace.
- The level of physical fitness required for our activities is given as a very general indication.

How you can book your shore excursions:

- Shore excursions can be booked on board, using the "sign-up lists" available at the Library.
- The price of the excursion will be added to your on-board account.
- A minimum number of participants is required for each tour; if the required number is not attained, the tour may be cancelled.
- To provide the best service and to avoid disappointments, please book your shore excursions as early as possible: places are limited and there is a booking deadline for each port.
- Cancellation and changes are possible until the booking deadline. After the booking deadline, 100% cancellation fees will be charged. Booking deadlines will be indicated on the Daily Program and on the booking forms.
- Transfers can also be prepaid prior to your cruise.

Important notes:

- Departure times of the excursions are mentioned in the Daily Program of each port, which you will receive in your cabin the evening before each stopover.
- All information concerning excursions is correct at the time of printing. However, Star Clippers reserves the right to make changes. The latest updated tour descriptions are available on board the ship in a file at the Library and on Star Clippers' website (you can download the file using the QR code).

MOTRIL - Secrets of Granada: Albaycín and Capilla Real

Sightseeing | History & Culture

Leaving Motril, you will head north through the olive groves towards Granada, with views of the Alpujarras and the Sierra Nevada. After a 50-minute drive you will reach the centre of Granada, at 800 metres above sea level, and begin your guided tour of the stunning city of Granada. You will visit the Capilla Real, the burial place of the famous Catholic monarchs Isabel and Fernando, and the Cathedral of the Incarnation of God (inside visit if there is no ceremony), a marvel of the Spanish Renaissance, with its spectacular altar and gold and white interior.

Then you will walk through the Alcaicería (old silk market in Arabic style) and continue to the Albayzín (UNESCO World Heritage Site), the old Arabic quarter, which was the residence of the Moors even after the city was reclaimed by Spain. The balcony of San Nicolás offers the famous view of the Alhambra with the Sierra Nevada in the background. This old quarter is a maze of winding streets and has been preserved with its cisterns, fountains, squares, whitewashed houses, villas and the ruined remains of the old city gate.

Please note:

- ✓ This excursion involves extensive walking over uneven surfaces with some steps and inclines.
- ✓ Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat and water. Appropriate attire is required when visiting religious sites (no bare shoulders or shorts are allowed).
- ✓ The drive to Granada takes approx. 50 minutes (each way). The order of the visits is subject to change.

Discover Ibiza on our "off the beaten track" adventure, a fantastic opportunity to discover unusual places inaccessible by coach. The excursion starts with a transfer to San Antoni, where you will board a jeep and be taken inland "off the beaten track" to explore areas of the island untouched by the growing tourist industry, places that have remained unchanged for hundreds of years. The scenic route has been specially designed to showcase all of Ibiza's original beauty, passing through small rural villages, verdant valleys and mountain tracks, allowing you to see the island from a different perspective, not as a clubber's paradise, but as a perfectly preserved environment where nature reigns supreme.

During the tour you will visit the beautiful beach of Sa Caleta, the viewpoint of Es Vedrá, a magical place according to the locals. There will be a stop at Cala Comte, where you will have some free time to have a drink or a swim if you like. You will drive back to the cruise pier after this last stop.

Please note:

- ✓ This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility, pregnant women or anyone suffering from conditions (back, neck or other) which may be affected by bumpy roads. Each 4x4 vehicle can accommodate 6 pax.
- ✓ Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat and water. If you plan to swim at the beach, wear a swimsuit under your clothes and bring a towel from the ship and sunscreen.
- ✓ There is a 40-minutes (unguided) transfer between the port and the base of the jeeps at the beginning of the tour.



PALMA DE MALLORCA - Highlights of Palma and Cathedral

Sightseeing | History & Culture

Palma is the capital of the Balearic Islands and is located on the south-east coast of the island of Mallorca. A wealth of architectural highlights await you. Board your coach for your first stop at the 14th century circular Bellver Castle, one of the few circular castles in the world and the only one of its kind in Europe. Built in a military-influenced Gothic style, it sits on a hill with panoramic views over the city and surrounding countryside. Continue to the magnificent 13th-century La Seu Cathedral, which dominates the city and is one of Europe's finest examples of pure Gothic Revival architecture. After exploring the interior of the cathedral, see the adjacent Almudaina Palace (no internal visit). This austere palace was originally an Arab fortress and later the palace of the kings of Mallorca. Before returning to the cruise port, you will stop to see the unique style and architectural engineering of the city's famous bullring.

Please note:

- ✓ This tour involves extensive walking over cobblestone surfaces with many steps and inclines.
- ✓ Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat and water. Appropriate attire is required when visiting religious sites (no bare shoulders or shorts are allowed).
- ✓ On Sundays and holidays the Cathedral is not open to visitors. The history of the Cathedral will be given outside.
- ✓ Bellver Castle is closed on Mondays and the visit will be from the outside only with extra time for shopping.

MENORCA (Mahón) - Hiking in S'Albufera nature park

Active & Adventure | Nature

This is a must for nature lovers, the wildlife is abundant in this protected area and the coastal views are simply stunning! A short 15 minute drive will take you to Es Grau, a typical Menorcan village in the middle of S'Albufera Natural. The park includes the wetlands, a marshy coastal area consisting of a 2km long lagoon surrounded by a system of dunes and a river that flows into the sea. You will be taken on an itinerary designed to showcase the flora and fauna of the wetlands. The park is home to a wide variety of bird species; waterfowl such as ducks, coots, herons and shags live alongside birds of prey such as ospreys, kites and booted eagles, while the streams and ponds of the wetlands are populated by Iberian green frogs and toads. The vegetation consists mainly of wild olive trees, holm oaks, lentisk, jasmine box and tree spurge. The route takes you along the Cami de Cavalls, a bridleway that goes around the island, through the woods and then along the water reserve that leads to the beach of Es Grau. From here, follow a winding path up to the headland overlooking Isla Colom off the north coast. Continue down to Cala Tamarells before returning along the beach to the village of Es Grau.

Please note:

- ✓ This tour involves extensive walking (approx. 5 km) over hilly natural terrain.
- ✓ Dress for the weather, wear proper hiking shoes and bring a hat and water.
- ✓ The journey between the cruise pier and the nature reserve takes approximately 15min each way.

Sightseeing | Food & Wine

For a taste of the good life in Provence, visit the delightful village of Ramatuelle.

A short drive south-west, past sun-drenched mountains and vineyards, brings you to the village perched on a rocky outcrop just a few miles from the sea. This old Provençal town has narrow, winding streets with arches and vaults, and old houses, now restored, huddled against the wall near the church. But it's the incomparable views over the countryside and the Gulf of St Tropez that make Ramatuelle so special. Take the time to enjoy the magnificent panoramas. After visiting Ramatuelle, drive to a local winery in the heart of the Saint Tropez peninsula and enjoy a tasting of rosé, red and white AOP wines.

Please note:

- ✓ This tour involves moderate walking over cobblestone surfaces with some steps and uneven surfaces to negotiate.
- ✓ Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat and water.
- ✓ During low season, shopping opportunities in the villages are limited.
- ✓ The drive between Saint Tropez and Ramatuelle / the winery takes approximately 30 minutes (each way).

NICE

The ship will be alongside at one of the cruise pier of the port of Nice, located next to the city center and 10 km from Nice airport.

All guests are requested to leave the ship before 10:00am.

Star Clippers offers the following transfer services (optional, on request):

- Shared Transfer to Nice airport (NCE).

- ✓ Guests who have purchased a shared transfer cannot choose their own pick up time.
- ✓ There is a fixed departure from the port at 08:45 (arrival at the airport approx. 09:15).
- ✓ This transfer is suitable for guests whose flight departs after 11:15.

- Private transfers to Nice airport or to hotels in Nice.

- ✓ Pick up from the pier for private transfers is no later than 10:00.
- ✓ Private transfers are operated by private cars (1-2 passengers) or private vans (3-4 passengers).

- Private transfers from hotels to the airport

- ✓ Private transfers are operated by private cars (1-2 passengers) or private vans (3-4 passengers).
- ✓ This service can only be pre-booked.

Transfers can also be booked prior to your cruise.

Bookings made on board during the cruise are always subject to availability.

If you wish to book a private transfer, we recommend that you pre-book it well in advance prior to your cruise, as the number of vehicles may be limited at certain times of the year.

EXCURSIONS ACTIVITY LEVEL:

- ✓ **Easy:** excursion accessible to all participants, as it mainly takes place by bus or boat. Any footpaths and stairs that need to be negotiated are short or easy.
- ✓ **Moderate:** a certain basic level of fitness is required; excursion involving moderate walking - sometimes over uneven or unpaved paths and stairs.
- ✓ **Moderate to strenuous:** active participation is required; excursion involving walking long distances over uneven or steep terrain. May involve several flights of stairs or extended staircases.
- ✓ **Strenuous:** a good level of fitness is required; an excursion involving extensive uphill walking on inclines, uneven terrain with many steps. Excursion involving off-road driving, not suitable for pregnant women or anyone with a medical condition (back, neck, etc.) that could be affected by bumpy roads.
- ✓ **Active (sport):** Very good physical condition, stamina and skill are required. Passengers should be fit and active to participate in tours involving hiking, kayaking, snorkeling, cycling or similar activities.

The level of physical fitness required for our activities is given as a very general indication.

MAIN EXCURSIONS CATEGORIES:

- ✓ **Culture & History:** it explores places of historical significance, visits ancient ruins or historic buildings, gives a deeper understanding of the region's heritage.
- ✓ **Sightseeing:** it gives a quick but enriching overview, visiting and seeing the main attractions, landmarks and places of interest in a particular area, often including popular spots and sometimes hidden gems.
- ✓ **Food & Wine:** it explores the culinary traditions of a region, from local markets and vineyards to cooking classes or wine tastings.
- ✓ **Panoramic:** it involves a limited number of long drives with commentary by the guide, no internal visits and - generally - limited walking between stops.
- ✓ **Active & Adventure:** Hiking, kayaking, cycling, ATV, 4x4 off-road.

WHAT TO WEAR AND BRING WHEN GOING ASHORE ON EXCURSION:

- ✓ Unless special clothing suggestions are included in the excursion description, we recommend functional clothing and comfortable footwear.
- ✓ Comfortable shoes to help with any steep paths and uneven cobbles.
- ✓ A hat or cap and sun lotion.
- ✓ Water.
- ✓ For boat excursions or excursions including beach stop: swimsuit, beach towel, sunglasses, sunscreen, water shoes, snorkel mask.
- ✓ Mobile phone or camera to capture the moment.
- ✓ Ship card to get back on board.
- ✓ Some cash in local currency.
- ✓ A copy of the Daily Program, to check last tender or last gangway time, tender schedule, lunch time, etc.
- ✓ For ports with tender service (ship at anchor), bring a rucksack or fanny pack so that your hands are free to hold on to the safety grip when boarding the tender.
