What you need to know before booking your shore excursion:

- All our excursions are led by English-speaking guides. A second language may be used, depending on the number of non-English-speaking passengers.
- The length of the tours and time spent on the sites is given as an indication as it may vary depending on weather, sea and traffic conditions and on the group's pace.
- The level of physical fitness required for our activities is given as a very general indication.

How you can book your shore excursions:

- Shore excursions can be booked on board, using the "sign-up lists" available at the Library.
- The price of the excursion will be added to your on-board account.
- Transfers and debark tours ending at the airport can also be pre-paid prior to your cruise.
- In order to provide the best service and to avoid disappointments, please book your shore excursions as early as possible: places are limited and there is a booking deadline for each port.
- Booking deadlines will be indicated on the Daily Program and on the booking forms.
- Cancellation and changes are possible until the booking deadline. After the booking deadline, 100% cancellation fees will be charged.
- A minimum number of participants is required for each tour; if the required number is not attained, the tour may be cancelled.

Important notes:

- Departure times of the excursions are mentioned in the Daily Program of each port, which you will receive in your cabin the evening before each stopover.
- All information concerning excursions is correct at the time of printing. However, Star Clippers reserves the right to make changes. The latest updated tour descriptions are available on board the ship in a file at the Library and on Star Clippers' website (you can download the file using the QR code).

TANGIER - Secrets of Tangier

Tangier, the gateway to Morocco, is a city of striking contrasts and fascinating history. Situated at the northern tip of the country where the Mediterranean Sea meets the Atlantic Ocean, it has been a crossroads of civilizations for centuries, influenced by Phoenician, Roman, Arab, Portuguese, Spanish, and French cultures. Its strategic location at the Strait of Gibraltar made it an important port and trading hub, and until 1956, Tangier was an international zone, attracting diplomats, writers, artists, and explorers from around the world. Today, the city retains a cosmopolitan charm, with its bustling medina, historic Kasbah, elegant European-style boulevards, and lively port. Tangier is a vibrant tapestry of whitewashed houses, Moorish palaces, narrow winding streets, colorful souks, and panoramic coastal views, offering visitors an immersive experience of Morocco's rich culture, architecture, and traditions.

A coach awaits you at the port for a drive along the famous Corniche to the Kasbah. During a guided walking tour, you will explore the old town with its colorful souks, Moorish architecture, traditionally decorated doors, and narrow winding alleyways. The tour includes a stop to enjoy a refreshing mint tea and delicious Moroccan pastries, followed by some free time for shopping before returning to the port.

- ✓ This tour involves extensive walking over cobblestone and uneven surfaces with inclines and many steps.
- ✓ Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat and water.
- ✓ Guests can do shopping on their own during their free time.

GIBRALTAR - Gibraltar's history and heritage

Depart the ship and head north towards the Spanish border. On the way you will cross the airstrip completed in 1942 and used by General Eisenhower during Operation Torch, the Allied invasion of North Africa. The minibus then heads to Europa Point, the southernmost point of Gibraltar.

On a clear day you can see across the Straits to North Africa, including Ceuta and the Rif Mountains of Morocco. From Europa Point, continue to the Great Siege Tunnels and visit this labyrinth of tunnels inside the Rock of Gibraltar.

During the Great Siege, the gallant defenders were stunned when the Spanish and French besiegers dug trenches too close to Gibraltar for the British to fire on them. Imaginative solutions were needed, and Sergeant Major Ince suggested digging tunnels to reach a rock outcrop so that the British guns could fire sideways at the attackers.

As the tunnel was dug by hand through the solid rock, the dust was so stifling that air vents were created, and it was then realised that these holes would make excellent embrasures for guns. The Great Siege Tunnels are a testament to British ingenuity, sheer courage and determination, and perhaps the most ingenious defence system devised by man in 1783. Finally, take a transfer back to the pier.

Please note: There will be driver-guides on the tour. This tour involves a lot of walking through tunnels and over hilly and cobblestone terrain. The order of the visits is subject to change.

The monkeys are wild animals, please do not attempt to touch or feed them.

Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat and water.



GIBRALTAR - Gibraltar's rock tour

Depart the ship and head north towards the Spanish border. On the way you will cross the airstrip completed in 1942 and used by General Eisenhower during Operation Torch, the Allied invasion of North Africa. The minibus then heads to Europa Point, the southernmost point of Gibraltar.

On a clear day you can see across the Straits to North Africa, including Ceuta and the Rif Mountains of Morocco. From Europa Point the walk continues to the Upper Rock and St Michael's Cave.

The cave was formed when rainwater slowly seeped through the limestone, turning into a carbonic acid solution that dissolved the rock. Over thousands of years, tiny crevices grew into long passages and deep caverns with an amazing collection of stalactites and stalagmites. The cave was well known to the Greeks and Romans and was the subject of many legends. It was thought to be a bottomless pit and the fantastic rock formations made it easy to believe that it was in fact the gateway to the underworld. Today the cave has shed its sinister reputation and is used for live shows, concerts and an annual world music festival. After visiting the cave, we will pay our respects to some of Gibraltar's most popular residents, the famous Barbary macaques, the only free-roaming monkeys in Europe. Legend has it that the monkeys arrived in Gibraltar from Morocco by following an underground passage under the Straits that ends at St Michael's Cave. The tour continues to the old town and the city centre before returning to the ship.

Please note: There will be driver-guides on the tour. This tour involves extensive walking over uneven surfaces. The ground at St Michael's cave is wet and slippery and there are a lot of steps to negotiate.

The monkeys are wild animals, please do not attempt to touch or feed them.

Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat and water.

SAFI – Marrakech, the Red City

Marrakech, also known as the "Red City", is the most important of Morocco's four imperial cities. The city has a long history and offers visitors magnificent palaces straight out of the Arabian Nights, fabulous gardens, mosques and Koranic schools. Home to intellectuals, writers and talented craftsmen, this bustling commercial centre is a blend of exotic cultures and the undisputed capital of southern Morocco.

The drive to Marrakech takes approximately 3 hours, but there will be a 10 minute comfort stop along the way.

The visit begins with a tour of the magnificent Bahia Palace, where enchanting Moorish gardens surround beautiful buildings with finely carved ceilings. You will then proceed to the Medina, the ancient fortified city guarded by battlements. Here you will see the famous Koutoubia minaret, a landmark that can be seen from virtually anywhere in Marrakech. After a typical Moroccan lunch and a traditional folklore performance, you will be ready to explore the heart of Marrakech, the famous Djamma El Fna square with its snake charmers, tooth pullers, storytellers and acrobats who perform every day at sunset. The pleasantly cool and shady medina is home to dozens of craft guilds, from wool dyers to coppersmiths and spice merchants. There are several entrances to the souks from Djamma El Fna Square, and at the end of the tour you will have time to browse before the three-hour drive back to the port of Safi.

- ✓ Lunch is included and will be served in a local restaurant serving Moroccan specialties.
- ✓ This tour involves a long drive (approximately 3 hours each way between Safi and Marrakech).
- ✓ There is no shopping stop during the tour. Guests can do shopping on their own during their free time.



SAFI - Essaouira

With its ancient red walls, Essaouira is undoubtedly one of Morocco's most charming and attractive coastal towns. Essaouira means 'enclosed', which is probably due to the imposing city wall that surrounds the beautiful old town, which has been declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site. You will be enchanted by the gleaming whitewashed houses with blue shutters, the art galleries, the woodworking workshops and the fishermen with their colourful boats. The town faces a group of rocky islands and is surrounded by an expanse of empty sandy beaches and dunes. The tranquillity of Essaouira today contrasts with its rich and turbulent history. The Portuguese built the fortress of Mogador (the former name of Essaouira) here in 1506, and throughout the 16th century England, France, Spain and the Netherlands all tried to conquer the place. This ancient trading and fishing port has been shaped by many different foreign influences over the years, resulting in a charming mix of Portuguese, Berber and French architecture. You will visit the Bab Marrakech square, La Scala, the old town and the old port ("le Vieux port"). Enjoy lunch in a local restaurant serving fish specialties. After lunch, you will have some free time to shop on your own in Bab Marrakech Square or relax in charming cafes overlooking the Atlantic Ocean. Return to the port of Safi (2.5 coach journey) after the free time.

- ✓ Lunch is included and will be served in a local restaurant serving fish specialties.

LANZAROTE (Arrecife) - Timanfaya National Park and La Geria vineyards

On this tour you will board your coach and set off for the southern part of the island, passing the picturesque villages of Macher and Uga and crossing streams of black lava before arriving at the Timanfaya National Park, which covers a unique volcanic landscape created between 1730 and 1736, when more than 100 volcanoes along a 50km stretch devastated this part of the island, destroying several villages. The last eruptions were in 1824, but due to the very low rainfall on the island and the lack of erosion, the site has remained intact and appears as it did immediately after the eruptions, a natural museum. On the Islote de Hilario hill you will see that the thermal power of the volcanoes is still visible. Park staff will show you how dry weeds thrown on the ground catch fire instantly, while water poured into a hole produces steam like a mini geyser. Food can even be cooked as the heat from the earth's core acts as a natural barbecue. On the 'Lunar Route' into the heart of the National Park we learn about the history of the volcanoes and see rare plants that illustrate how life can slowly conquer even the most inhospitable environment. The excursion continues with a visit to the La Geria wine region, where over the centuries the locals have learnt to adapt viticultural techniques to this unique landscape and produce the famous Malvasia wines. You will be amazed to see vines growing in the black holes left by volcanoes, and will visit a local wine cellar to taste one small glass of wine before returning to the cruise pier in Arrecife.

Please note:

- ✓ This tour includes a long panoramic drive on mountain winding roads, so this is not the ideal tour for guests suffering from motion sickness.
- ✓ Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat and water.
- ✓ The excursion includes transportation, a licensed guide, entrance to Timanfaya National Park (€30 per person), and a visit to a winery in La Geria.



TENERIFE (Santa Cruz) - Las Cañadas del Teide National Park

The tour starts with a drive to the old colonial capital of La Laguna, set in the Aguere Valley and surrounded by beautiful scenery. From La Laguna, the route follows the foothills of the mountain range through the Esperanza pine forests and foothills to the Teide National Park.

Declared a National Park in 1954, Cañadas del Teide National Park encompasses an enormous volcanic crater, 48 km in circumference, from which rises Mount Teide, a legendary 3,718 metre volcano that can be seen from many points on the island.

The park itself lies at an altitude of around 2,000 metres, and in winter snow falls, gales blow and the roads are sometimes closed. During the summer months this arid landscape, which gives the impression of having stepped into a lunar landscape or a cowboy film, can reach temperatures in excess of 40C. Enjoy the breathtaking views of the lava plains of Unaca and admire the famous wind eroded rock formations. You can walk back to the Parador Hotel for a coffee or tea (at your own expense) before boarding the coach for the return journey.

Please note:

- ✓ This excursion includes a long drive on mountain roads to approx. 2000 meters above sea level. This tour is not suitable for heart patients or people with breathing problems, due to altitude that will be reached.
- ✓ Wear weather-appropriate clothes (warm clothing recommended) and comfortable walking shoes and bring water.
- ✓ It is forbidden to remove any stones or plants from the National Park.

GRAN CANARIA (Las Palmas)

The ship will be alongside at Muelle Santa Catalina in Las Palmas cruise port, situated at 0.5 km distance from Las Palmas city center (next to the "El Muelle" shopping mall) and 26 km from Gran Canaria airport.

All guests are requested to leave the ship before 10:00am.

Star Clippers offers the following transfer services (optional, on request):

- Shared Transfer to Gran Canaria airport (LPA).

- ✓ Guests who have purchased a shared transfer cannot choose their own pick up time.
- ✓ There is a fixed departure from the port at 09:00 (arrival at the airport approx. 09:30).
- ✓ This transfer is suitable for guests whose flight departs after 11:30.

- Private transfers to Gran Canaria airport.

- ✓ Pick up from the pier for private transfers is no later than 10:00.
- ✓ Private transfers are operated by private cars (1-2 passengers) or private vans (3-4 passengers).

- Private transfers from hotels to the airport.

- ✓ Private transfers are operated by private cars (1-2 passengers) or private vans (3-4 passengers).
- ✓ This service can only be pre-booked.

Transfers can also be booked prior to your cruise.

Bookings made on board during the cruise are always subject to availability.

If you wish to book a private transfer, we recommend that you pre-book it well in advance prior to your cruise, as the number of vehicles may be limited at certain times of the year.

EXCURSIONS ACTIVITY LEVEL:

- ✓ **Easy:** excursion accessible to all participants, as it mainly takes place by bus or boat. Any footpaths and stairs that need to be negotiated are short or easy.
- ✓ **Moderate:** a certain basic level of fitness is required; excursion involving moderate walking - sometimes over uneven or unpaved paths and stairs.
- ✓ **Moderate to strenuous:** active participation is required; excursion involving walking long distances over uneven or steep terrain. May involve several flights of stairs or extended staircases.
- ✓ **Strenuous:** a good level of fitness is required; an excursion involving extensive uphill walking on inclines, uneven terrain with many steps. Excursion involving off-road driving, not suitable for pregnant women or anyone with a medical condition (back, neck, etc.) that could be affected by bumpy roads.
- ✓ **Active (sport):** Very good physical condition, stamina and skill are required. Passengers should be fit and active to participate in tours involving hiking, kayaking, snorkeling, cycling or similar activities.

The level of physical fitness required for our activities is given as a very general indication.

MAIN EXCURSIONS CATEGORIES:

- ✓ **Culture & History:** it explores places of historical significance, visits ancient ruins or historic buildings, gives a deeper understanding of the region's heritage.
- ✓ **Sightseeing:** it gives a quick but enriching overview, visiting and seeing the main attractions, landmarks and places of interest in a particular area, often including popular spots and sometimes hidden gems.
- ✓ **Food & Wine:** it explores the culinary traditions of a region, from local markets and vineyards to cooking classes or wine tastings.
- ✓ **Panoramic:** it involves a limited number of long drives with commentary by the guide, no internal visits and - generally - limited walking between stops.
- ✓ **Active & Adventure:** Hiking, kayaking, cycling, ATV, 4x4 off-road.

WHAT TO WEAR AND BRING WHEN GOING ASHORE ON EXCURSION:

- ✓ Unless special clothing suggestions are included in the excursion description, we recommend functional clothing and comfortable footwear.
- ✓ Comfortable shoes to help with any steep paths and uneven cobbles.
- ✓ A hat or cap and sun lotion.
- ✓ Water.
- ✓ For boat excursions or excursions including beach stop: swimsuit, beach towel, sunglasses, sunscreen, water shoes, snorkel mask.
- ✓ Mobile phone or camera to capture the moment.
- ✓ Ship card to get back on board.
- ✓ Some cash in local currency.
- ✓ A copy of the Daily Program, to check last tender or last gangway time, tender schedule, lunch time, etc.
- ✓ For ports with tender service (ship at anchor), bring a rucksack or fanny pack so that your hands are free to hold on to the safety grip when boarding the tender.
